Construction of IHHL

2145. SHRI V. ELUMALAI:

Will the Minister of **DRINKING WATER AND SANITATION** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has achieved just above half of the set target on construction of Individual House Hold Latrines (IHHLs) under the sanitation scheme in the past five years and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether against the target to construct 426.32 lakh and 469.76 lakh Individual House Hold Latrines (IHHLs) for BPL and APL families respectively, only 223.32 IHHLs were constructed; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof and the steps taken/being taken by the Government to construct IHHLs as per the target fixed in this regard?

ANSWER

(a) Since sanitation schemes are demand driven, no targets are fixed. However, the number of toilets constructed during the last five years and the current year is as under:-

- (b) As per Baseline Survey 2012-13, 472.24 lakh BPL and 639.16 lakh APL households were without toilets. Against this, 95.90 lakh and 113.82 lakh Individual household latrines for BPLs and APLs have been constructed so far after the Baseline Survey 2012-13.
- (c) The Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) {SBM-G} has been launched on 2nd October, 2014. The SBM (G) aims at attaining Swachh Bharat by 2nd October, 2019 by accelerating sanitation coverage in the rural areas. Under this programme, the following steps have been taken:-
 - The focus of the scheme now is on behavior change and usage of toilets. Community based collective behaviour change is mentioned as preferred approach, although the States are free to choose their approach.
 - Provision of incentives for the construction of Individual household latrine (IHHL) has been raised to Rs.12000 for all Below poverty Line (BPL) households and to identified Above Poverty Line (APL) households (all SCs /STs, small and marginal farmers, landless labourers with homestead, physically handicapped and women-headed households).
 - The partial funding of incentive from MGNREGS has been stopped. The entire assistance now being provided under one programme.
 - Flexibility has been provided to States in the implementation of the programme.
 - Partnerships of various stakeholders working on rural sanitation including Multilateral organisations, Civil Society Organisations, Self Help Groups (SHGs), Institutions etc. is being promoted.
 - The budget for rural sanitation, was Rs.2300 crore and Rs. 2850 crore in 2013-14 and 2014-15 respectively. These have been increased to Rs. 6525 crore in 2015-16 and Rs. 9000 crore in 2016-17
 - State/Regional level workshops involving all the key stakeholders such as Collectors, CEO, Zilla Panchayats, Chairmen Zilla Panchayats etc. are being held.
 - Centre-State coordination has been increased.
 - Social media [twitter (@swachbharat), Facebook (Swachh Bharat Mission), HIKE and WhatsApp] is being extensively used for sharing innovative ideas and cross-learning.
 - An Expert Committee headed by Dr. R.A. Mashelkar to examine various Innovative Technologies has been formed. This committee has enlisted various innovative technologies and a Compendium consisting of such technologies has been published and uploaded in the website of the Ministry for benefits of various stakeholders.
 - Quarterly exhibition of innovative technologies Indovations are being held. Three such exhibitions were organized in New Delhi on 26-27th August 2014, 23-24 January 2015 and 2-3 July2015 wherein various innovative technologies in respect of Toilet, Solid and Liquid Waste Management and Water Treatment were showcased.
