LINKING OF BACKWARD AREAS TO NHS

Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

- (a) whether linking the backward districts and areas by roads and national highways in the country is necessary for development of the country;
- (b) if so, the reaction of the Government thereto;
- (c) whether the Government has prepared any action plan for giving priority to construction of road highways in the said areas;
- (d) if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) the names of the districts along with their States identified in this regard?

(a) to (e) The Ministry has taken up detailed review of National Highways (NHs) network with a view to improve the road connectivity to coastal / border areas, backward areas, religious places, tourist places, construction / rehabilitation / widening of about 1,500 major bridges and 208 Railway Over Bridges (ROBs) / Railway Under Bridges (RUBs) on NHs, improvement of newly declared NHs providing connectivity to District Head Quarters, Connectivity Improvement Program for Char-Dham (Kedarnath, Badrinath, Yamunothri & Gangothri in Uttarakhand) under proposed Bharatmala Pariyojana. However, the Bharatmala Pariyojana is yet to be formally launched.
