- (d) whether any feasibility studies have been conducted or report prepared so far regarding the fact that the revival of Saraswati river can help in recharging the ground water, developing eco-tourism and maintaining ecological balance; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

- (d) No, Madam. Several studies including explorations and excavations have been carried out both by the Governmental and non-governmental organizations along
- the palaeochannel, represented today by the Ghaggar river in Haryana, Punjab, Rajasthan and Gujarat. Some researchers have ascribed this palaeochannel to the Sarasati river mentioned in Ancient Indian Literature, but no scientific evidence to establish this correlation exists.
