ASSISTANCE FOR FRUIT CROP AND FLORICULTURE

2827. DR. PRABHAS KUMAR SINGH:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the percentage of subsidy on the total investment given to the farmers for fruit crop and floriculture;
- (b) the details of maximum subsidy amount that can be availed by a farmer;
- (c) whether the subsidy is given to the farmers in installment, if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) whether there is any plan with the Government to increase assistance for area expansion programme taken up under the National Horticulture Mission, if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a): Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH) is being implemented during XII Plan, a Centrally Sponsored Scheme w.e.f. 2014-15, for holistic growth of the horticulture sector covering fruits, vegetables, root and tuber crops, mushrooms, spices, flowers, aromatic plants, coconut, cashew, cocoa and bamboo.

Under MIDH, subsidy is provided @ 40% of cost to farmers for establishment of new gardens of fruit crops. In case of NE and Himalayan States, TSP areas, Andaman & Nicobar and Lakshadweep Island, the assistance is 50% of cost. In case of area coverage of flowers, the subsidy is provided @40% of cost of small & marginal farmers, 25% of cost to other category of farmers in general areas and 50% of cost in NE and Himalayan States TSP areas, Andaman & Nicobar & Lakshadweep Islands.

(b): Under MIDH, for area expansion farmer can avail maximum subsidy of Rs.2.20 lakh/ha for general areas whereas, Rs.2.75 lakh/ha for NE and Himalayan States, TSP areas, Andaman & Nicobar and Lakshadweep Islands.

Under floriculture, for area expansion farmer can avail maximum subsidy of Rs.60,000/ha for general areas whereas, Rs.75,000/ha. for NE and Himalayan States, TSP areas, Andaman & Nicobar and Lakshadweep Islands.

(c): Under MIDH, subsidy is provided in one (1), two (2) or three (3) installments depending upon the types of fruit crops.

(d): At present, there is no proposal to increase assistance for area expansion under National Horticulture Mission (NHM)/Horticulture Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (HMNEH) sub schemes of MIDH.
