INSTRUMENT LANDING SYSTEM

- (a) the equipments and knowledge required for the pilots to handle instrument landing system to flight against fog;
- (b) the number of airports in the country equipped with CAT III B instrument landing system;
- (c) whether such system is likely to be installed on all the airports in the coming years; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof along with the names of airports where such system is likely to be installed during the current year and the next two years?

- (a) The pilot should be aware of the following information for using Instrument Landing System (ILS) to overcome fog
 - i) Availability of the visual and non visual facilities at airport prior to commencing category II or III approach
 - ii) Appropriate Low Visibility Procedure (LVP) is in force according to information received from Air Traffic services before commencing the ILS category II or III approach
 - iii) The flight crew members are properly qualified and trained prior to commencing Category II or III approach
 - iv) Current visibility and Runway Visual Range (RVR) information
 - v) Aircraft is certified for Category II or III operations
 - (b) to (d) Only IGI Airport, New Delhi is equipped with CAT IIIB ILS System. CAT IIIB instrument is under installation at Amritsar, Jaipur, Kolkata and Lucknow Airports.
