(a) whether direct and indirect tax collection so far in this financial year is an all time high, if so, the details thereof during the last three years;

(b) whether cuts in spending in various items by all Ministries and stringent measures taken by the tax department on tax evaders resulted in surge in tax collection and savings, if so, the details thereof; and

(c) whether the Government has any proposal to award the taxmen for their best performance and if so, the details thereof?

(a) The net direct and indirect tax collection during the current financial year i.e 2015-16 is showing an overall positive growth as on 31.01.2016. The details of Net Direct and Indirect Tax collection during the last three financial years is as per table below:
