#### AVAILABILITY OF VENTILATOR BEDS

#### 603. SHRI KAUSHAL KISHORE:

### Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has issued guidelines for providing ventilator bed facility in an emergency situation on immediate basis to seriously ill persons including accident victims in all Government/private hospitals particularly Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital and Safdarjung Hospital;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the guidelines in this regard;
- (c) the action taken/proposed to be taken against the hospitals which express inability to provide ventilator bed facility to seriously ill patients in an emergency; and
- (d) the other corrective steps taken/ being taken by the Government in this regard?

# ANSWER THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI JAGAT PRAKASH NADDA)

(a) to (d): Since Health is a State subject, it is the responsibility of the State Government to issue such guidelines and take action against the Hospitals, who refuse to provide treatment to seriously ill persons including accident victims.

However, in pursuance of judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Writ Petition No. 235 of 2012, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare have issued guidelines in August 2015, to all States/UTs on Good Samaritans in which, *inter alia*, it has been mentioned that "Lack of response by a doctor in an emergency situation pertaining to road accidents, where he is expected to provide care, shall constitute "professional Misconduct" under Chapter 7 of the Indian Medical Council (Professional Conduct, Etiquette and Ethics) Regulation, 2002 and disciplinary action shall be taken against such doctors under Chapter 8 of the said Regulations." It is the responsibility of the respective State Government/UT to take action against the said Hospitals.

In so far as three central Govt. Hospitals viz. Safdarjung Hospital, Dr. RML Hospital and LHMC are concerned, they have adequate number of ventilator bed facilities in an emergency situation.
