Will the Minister of YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS be pleased to state:

- (a) the number and details of stadia in the country for organising International games, State-wise;
- (b) the number of new stadia proposed for construction in the country; and
- (c) whether the Government proposes to construct stadia in the districts of UP including Allahabad and if so, the details thereof?

#### ANSWER

# THE MINISTER OF STATE (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) FOR YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS (SHRI SARBANANDA SONOWAL)

- (a) There are a number of stadia at various places in the country for organizing international games, but a comprehensive list of such stadia is not maintained by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports. The stadia selected for hosting the U-17 FIFA World Cup in 2017 includes.
  - 1. JLN Stadium, New Delhi (Under the control of Sports Authority of India).
  - 2. D.Y. Patil Stadium, Navi Mumbai
  - 3. JLN Stadium, Kochi
  - 4. Salt Lake Stadium, Kolkata
  - 5. JLN Stadium, Fatorda, Goa
  - 6. I.G. Stadium, Guwahati

As far as the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports is concerned, the Sports Authority of India (SAI) manages and operates the following five stadia. All the five Stadia are capable of hosting international sports events:-

- 1. Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium for International events of Athletics.
- 2. Indira Gandhi Indoor Sports Complex for International events of Gymnastics, Wrestling and Cycling.
- 3. Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium for International events of Hockey.
- 4. Dr. Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Swimming Pool Complex for International events of Swimming, Diving and Water Polo.
- 5. Dr. Karni Singh Shooting Range for International events of Shooting.
- (b) & (c): At present there is no such proposal with the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports for construction of Stadia.
