Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the salient features of Government's policy of providing security to public and private institutions;
- (b) whether the Union Government has provided security cover of armed CISF commandos to several private establishments during 2014-15 and 2015-16;
- (c) if so, the details of such private establishments provided CISF security during the above period along with the reasons and justifications thereof;
- (d) whether in view of shortage of CISF commandos across the country, the Government proposes to withdraw CISF security from private establishments; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

(a): Security to public and private institutions is provided based on threat perceptions and internal security requirements. If CISF is deployed at private institutions, the cost of deployment is normally borne by the institution concerned.

(b) & (c): Details of CISF deployment at private establishments during 2014-15 and 2015-16 are given below:-
