#### \*85. SHRI P.K. BIJU:

#### **SHRIMATI JYOTI DHURVE:**

Will the Minister of AYURVEDA, YOGA AND NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMOEOPATHY (AYUSH) be pleased to state:

- (a) the target fixed and achieved under various Centrally sponsored schemes and central sector schemes being implemented for the development and promotion of Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha and Homoeopathy (AYUSH) during each of the last three years, stream and State/UT-wise;
- (b) the details of the funding pattern along with the funds earmarked, released and utilised under each of the scheme during each of the last three years and the current financial year, stream and State/UT-wise;
- (c) whether provision exists for upgrading and strengthening the AYUSH infrastructure including hospitals, dispensaries, educational institutions, pharmacies and testing laboratories, training colleges and centres, if so, the details thereof;
- (d) the details of proposals received by the Government from States/UTs for upgrading and strengthening the infrastructure of AYUSH through State Annual Action Plan, stream-wise along with the action taken by the Government thereon; and
- (e) the other measures taken by the Government for the development, promotion and creating awareness of AYUSH?

#### **ANSWER**

# THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYURVEDA, YOGA & NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMOEOPATHY(AYUSH) (SHRI SHRIPAD YESSO NAIK)

(a) to (e): A statement is laid on the Table of the House

### STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO 85 FOR 29<sup>TH</sup> APRIL, 2016

- (a) The schemes of the Ministry of AYUSH are demand driven. The proposals are received from various State/UT Governments and other agencies and funds are released subject to viability of projects and availability of funds. However, the physical targets have been fixed in schemes under the National Medicinal Plants Board(NMPB). The physical achievements are at Annexure-I.
- (b) The funding pattern of Central Sector Schemes is on 100% basis. However for the Centrally Sponsored Schemes, the funding pattern during the last three years and current year has been as under:
  - (i) 2013-14 and 2014-15 (upto 28th September 2014): The funding pattern under the erstwhile Centrally Sponsored Schemes of Development of AYUSH Hospitals & Dispensaries was in the ratio of 75:25 between Centres and States except for NE States and three hilly States of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu and Kashmir, where the Grant-in-aid component from Government of India was 90% and remaining 10% is the State contribution. In respect of other erstwhile Centrally Sponsored Schemes viz. Development of Institutions, National Mission on Medicinal Plants and Drug Quality Control, the funding was on 100% basis.
  - (ii) For 29<sup>th</sup> September 2014 to 28.10.2015: The funding pattern under National AYUSH Mission which included AYUSH Services, Educational Institutions and Quality Control of ASU&H Drugs was in the ratio of 90:10 between Centre and States for special Category States (NE States and three hilly States of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu and Kashmir) towards all components under the scheme. For other States/UTs the sharing pattern was 75:25 between Centre and States. In respect of

Medicinal Plants, this component is financed on 100% by Central Government in North Eastern States and hilly State of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Jammu and Kashmir where as in other states it is shared in the ratio of 90:10 between Centre and State.

(iii) **After 28.10.2015**: The funding pattern of Centrally Sponsored Scheme for all components of National AYUSH Mission (including Medicinal Plants) has been revised in the ratio of 60:40 between Centre and States, while it would be in the ratio of 90:10 for 8 North East States and 3 Himalayan States (Jammu Kashmir, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh). The UTs will be funded as 100% basis by the Central Government.

A statement showing scheme-wise the funds earmarked and released during the last three years and current year is attached at <u>Annexure-II</u>. The State/UT wise releases made in respect of the Central and Centrally Sponsored Schemes during last three years and current year is at <u>Annexure-III</u>.

(c) Under different components of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme-National AYUSH Mission (NAM), there are provisions for upgrading and strengthening of the infrastructure of AYUSH including hospitals, dispensaries, educational institutions, pharmacies and testing laboratories. The details are enclosed as **Annexure-IV**.

The AYUSH infrastructure including hospitals, dispensaries, educational institutions, pharmacies and testing laboratories, training colleges and centres are also strengthened through other Central Sector Schemes of AYUSH.

- (d) The details of proposals received by the Government from State/UT Governments and other Institutions under NAM for upgrading and strengthening the infrastructure of AYUSH through State Annual Action Plan and funds allocated by the Government of India for the purpose during the last 2 years is enclosed as **Annexure-V**.
- (e) The measures taken by the Government for the development, promotion and creating awareness of AYUSH envisages upgradation of Research, improving quality of education & drugs, standardization & accreditation of Ayurveda, Yoga & Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha and Homoeopathy, cooperation and promotion of AYUSH with various countries, collaborative research with various countries, encouraging research in various Universities/Colleges through Extra Mural Research etc.

The details of measures proposed under the Schemes of Information, Education and Communication and National AYUSH Mission (NAM) for promotion and awareness of AYUSH is enclosed as **Annexure -VI.**

## A. Central Sector Scheme of Promotion of Information, Education and Communication(IEC)

The Ministry of AYUSH has been publicizing AYUSH Systems under Central Sector Scheme of Promotion of Information, Education and Communication(IEC) in AYUSH by undertaking the following activities:-

- i. Organization of Arogya Fairs both at the National and State Level;
- ii. Participation in Health Fairs/ Melas/Exhibitions organized by Government Departments, State Governments and other reputed Organizations;
- iii. Preparation and distribution of authentic Publicity material on AYUSH Systems including Multi-media/print media campaigns, audio visual materials for popularization of AYUSH Systems;
- iv. Providing financial assistance to reputed organizations, NGOs, Educational/ Research Institutes for organizing Seminars, Conferences, Symposiums, Workshop, Meeting, etc. on AYUSH Systems.
- v. Providing incentives to AYUSH Industry to participate in Arogya and other Fairs/ Melas/ Exhibitions/ Conferences/ Seminars etc organized by Central/ State Governments/ Government organizations/ reputed organizations like Chemexil, Pharmexcil, CII, FICCI, ASSOCHAM, ITPO etc at State/ National level.

#### B. Centrally Sponsored Scheme for National AYUSH Mission:

The measures proposed under National AYUSH Mission(NAM) for Promotion and awareness of AYUSH are as follows:

**Public Health Outreach activity:** Under this activity, it proposed focus on increasing awareness about AYUSH's strength in solving community health problems resulting from nutritional deficiencies, epidemics and vector-borne diseases, Maternal and Child Health Care etc. This component is aimed to provide grant-in-aid to State Government initiatives for the roll out of proven AYUSH interventions for improving health status of the population and also the identified National Campaigns by AYUSH, like Geriatric Campaign, Anti-anemia Campaign etc. through distribution of medicines, organizing Health awareness camps etc.

**Behavior Change Communication (BCC):** BCC has been included under National AYUSH Mission (NAM) to prevent communicable diseases and non-communicable diseases. Early prevention and case detection is the most important strategy of all non-communicable diseases which are generally emerged due to life style deviations and ill-healthy diet.

**AYUSH Gram:** AYUSH Gram is a concept wherein one village per block will be selected for adoption of method and practice of AYUSH way of life and interventions of health care. In AYUSH village AYUSH based lifestyles are promoted through behavioral change communication, training of village health workers towards identification and use of local medicinal herbs and provision of AYUSH health services. The elected village representatives are sensitized towards the concept so that there is also active participation from the community.

**School Health Programme through AYUSH:** Under this program it is proposed to provide easy access to health, nutrition and hygiene education and services through AYUSH systems of medicine is a simple and cost effective tool which can go a long way in the prevention and control of communicable and non-communicable diseases. The main focus of School Health Programme through AYUSH is to address the health needs of School going Children both physical and mental through providing AYUSH services including Yoga and counseling.

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
