REPAIR OF KV BUILDINGS

131. SHRI M. MURALI MOHAN:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that some of the Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) buildings are in dilapidated condition in the country;

(b) if so, the details thereof, State/UT-wise; and

(c) the steps taken/being taken by the Government to repair/reconstruct such buildings?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SMT. SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI)

(a) to (c): Repairs and reconstruction of Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) is a continuous process and depends upon various factors such as the condition of the buildings, availability of safe alternate accommodation, availability of funds etc. At present, 9 KV buildings have been identified as requiring major repairs and reconstruction, the details of which are as under:-

In 3 KVs located at Umaria, Hathras & Bandipur, which are functioning in temporary buildings provided by the sponsoring authorities, the sponsors have been requested to repair the buildings or provide alternate safe accommodation.
