#### **Electric Buses under FAME India**

#### 1428. SHRIMATI POONAMBEN MAADAM:

Will the Minister of HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has granted approval to certain States to introduce zero emission retrofitted electric buses under its flagship scheme, FAME India (Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Hybrid & Electric Vehicles in India).
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the amount allocation sanctioned for disbursement under the scheme:
- (c) whether there is lack of demand for electric and hybrid four-wheelers in the country;
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the manner in which the Government proposes to address this problem for successful implementation of the scheme;
- (e) whether the Government would save on oil import bill annually, if this scheme is implemented; and
- (f) whether there is potential interest to invest in the project, if so, the details thereof along with the proposals received in this regard?

- (e): Yes Madam. As per the National Mission on Electric Mobility, if present scheme continue till 2020, it is expected to save approximately 9500 million litre of crude oil equivalent of Rs. 62000 Crores.
- (f): No investment proposal has been received as of now.
