VISA FREE TRAVEL TO INDIA

1831. SHRIMATI VANAROJA R.:

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be please to state:

- (a) whether the Indian diaspora will no longer have to get a visa affixed on their passports every time they travel to India; and
- (b) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS [GEN. (DR) V. K. SINGH (RETD)]

(a) & (b) As per the current regulations, people of the Indian Diaspora holding a valid OCI (Overseas Citizen of India) card do not require to get a visa affixed on their passport every time they travel to India. An OCI card entails a lifelong visa for its holder. However, a person of Indian Diaspora not holding a valid OCI card will continue to require a visa on his/her passport for entering into India. These categories are however different from Non-Resident Indians (NRIs), who are Indian passport holders, and do not require a visa to enter India.
