**(a) to (c): Approval of Government for augmentation of infrastructure at Indian Naval Academy under Phase-II to cater for increase in training capacity from 750 to 1200 trainees was accorded on 19<sup>th</sup> December 2011 at a total cost of Rs. 340.72 Crores. To mitigate the infrastructure shortage at various other training establishments, the Training Infrastructure Perspective Plan (TIPP) 2013-27 has been drawn up by Indian Navy. Further, action has been taken for the development of various Operational Turn Round (OTR) Ports, Forward Operating Bases (FOBs) and Naval Detachments (NAV-DETS) as required along the Indian coastline for ensuring maritime security of the country.**
