Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government proposes to set up a Central Training institute in each State of the country;

(b) if so, the States where Central Training Institutions have already been set up including the status of the remaining States;

(c) if not, the reasons therefor; and

(d) the steps taken by the Government in this regard?

ANSWER

(a) to (d): No, Madam. There is no such proposal to set up a Central Training institute in each State of the country. However, the Government has launched a Central Sector Scheme of Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers & Teaching (PMMMNMTT) with all India coverage to address issues related to teachers, teaching, teacher preparation, professional development, curriculum design, designing and developing assessment & evaluation methodology, research in pedagogy and developing effective pedagogy. The Mission is addressing the current issues of supply of qualified teachers, attracting talent into teaching profession and raising the quality of teaching in schools and colleges and the long term goals of building a strong professional cadre of teachers and creating top class institutional facilities for innovative teaching and professional development of teachers.

Under the Mission, 30 Schools of Education in Central Universities, 50 Centres of Excellence for Curriculum and Pedagogy which include 5 Centres of Excellence in Science and Mathematics Education, 25 Teaching Learning Centres, 20 Faculty Development Centres, 2 Inter-University Centres for Teachers Education, one National Resource Centre for Education, 5 Centres of Academic Leadership and Education Management are being set up across the country.
