Choice-Based Credit System

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Delhi University has recently invited comments from teachers and students to take a final decision on changes to the Choice-Based Credit system (CBCS) grading system;
- (b) if so, whether the Government had set up a committee to look into issues related to examination under CBCS;
- (c) if so, the details of recommendations made by the committee and action taken by the Government thereon;
- (d) whether there is great resentment amongst students on CBCS and protecting against it; and
- (e) if so, the action taken by the Government in this regard?
