(b) the details of the naxal affected districts along with the number of bandhs called by naxalites during the said period, State-wise; and

(c) the details of the assistance provided to the naxal affected States for the development of security related infrastructure, setting up of Counter-insurgency and Jungle Warfare Training Schools and the utilization of the allocated funds during each of the last three years and the current year, State-wise?

(c): Government of India assists to LWE affected states for the development of security related infrastructure under the following schemes:-

'Special Infrastructure Scheme (SIS)' covers upgradation of existing roads/tracks, strengthening of construction of secure camping grounds and helipads, strengthening of existing Police Stations/Police Outposts, upgradation and strengthening of approach roads to Police Stations/Police outposts, Strengthening of existing Jails & Magazines (Armories/Bell of Arms) etc. State-wise details of funds released and its utilization during 2011-12, 2013-14 and 2014-15 are at Annexure-III.

Under the Scheme, 'Construction/Strengthening of Fortified Police Stations', 400 Police Stations (PSs) have been sanctioned to 10 LWE affected States @ Rs. 2.00 crore per police station on 80:20 (Centre share: State share). State-wise details of funds released and its Utilization during last three year & current year are at Annexure-IV.

Under the scheme of 'Setting up of Counter Insurgency Anti-Terrorist (CIAT) Schools', Ministry of Home Affairs had provided an amount of Rs.1.5 crores to each school for development of temporary infrastructure and also reimbursed the recurring expenditure towards remuneration to staff. State wise details of funds released and its Utilization during last three years are at Annexure-V.

The purpose of MPF Scheme is to strengthen the police infrastructure in the LWE affected states. State-wise details of funds released and its utilization thereof under MPF Scheme during 2013-14 to 2015-16 and the current year 2016-17 (as on 05.05.2016) are at Annexure-VI.
