- (c) the efforts taken to improve the life span of colour and to minimize the expenditure on colouring;
- (d) whether it is also proposed to set up Railway Design Centre; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof?

(a): No, Madam. However for certain special coaches/train service, different color schemes are evolved from time to time.

(b): The amount spent by Zonal Railways and Production Units for painting of rail coaches during the last three years and likely expenditure in current financial year is as under:

(c): Polyurethane paints, having longer service life than alkyd paints, are now being used in newly manufactured coaches. Further, special additives are also specified in the technical specification of paints to improve life. To minimize cost, wastage is controlled through use of Airless spray guns and various productivity improvement measures.

(d) & (e): Yes, Madam. A Memorandum of Understanding was signed between Ministry of Railways, New Delhi and National Institute of Design (NID), Ahmedabad on 10.04.15 for setting up of a Railway Design Centre (RDC) by NID at their campus in Ahmedabad for collaboration in identified fields of design relevant to rail transport and allied activities.
