Will the Minister of TRIBAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state

- (a) Whether the Government has received requests for inclusion of certain castes in the list of Scheduled Tribes during each of the last three years.
- (b) If so, the details thereof along with the action taken by the Government thereon so far State/UT-wise;
- (c) Whether the Government has received complaints of over-inclusion or under-inclusion of castes in the said list during the said period; and
- (d) If so, the details thereof, State/UT-wise along with the corrective action taken/being taken by the Government in this regard?

ANSWER

(a) to (c) Yes, Madam. Government has received proposals from State Governments / UT Administrations for inclusion of communities as STs. A statement in this regard is annexed. Government had laid down modalities for inclusion in and exclusion of communities / groups to the list of STs in a State, in the year 1999, amended in the year 2002. Proposal has been processed as per extant modality.

No proposal has been received as per extant modality to exclude any community from the list of STs from State Government.

(d) Does not arise in view of above.
