Doordarshan

Prasar Bharati has informed that Doordarshan News always endeavour to report on rural and remote areas with 804 Stringers and 167 Part Time Correspondents empanelled with it and sends its reporters/crew from Headquarters whenever any newsworthy event happens in any corner of the country.

All India Radio

As a Public broadcaster, All India Radio has a special responsibility to transmit news and programmes with a view to inform and enlighten the people, especially in the rural and remote areas. All India Radio has a wide reach, covering the whole country. AIR disseminates news and views to every section of population and also people living in the remote areas through its network of 46 Regional News Units (RNUs) located in different part of the country.

It is the constant endeavor of AIR to increase and further expand the coverage and strengthen its news gathering network, particularly from the rural area. For its news gathering, AIR has a team of 53 regular correspondents posts in State capitals and other important news generating centres. Besides, it has 518 Part-Time Correspondents (PTCs), mostly based at district headquarters, who file news to RNUs as well as headquarters in Delhi.
