Evaluation studies of Central Sector/ Centrally Sector schemes.

- (i) Evaluation of Voluntary Organizations Working for the Welfare of SCs in the States of Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh and West Bengal.
- (ii) Evaluation of Construction of Hostels for OBC Boys and Girls in the States of U.P., M.P. and Gujarat.
- (iii) Evaluation of Composite Regional Centers (CRCs) for Persons with Disabilities.
- (iv) Evaluation of National Scheduled Castes Finance and Development Corporation (NSFDC).
- (v) Evaluation of the effectiveness of Integrated Rehabilitation Centers for Addicts (IRCAs) getting grant-in-aid under the scheme of Assistance to Voluntary OerganizatioOns for Prevention of Alcoholism and Substance (Drugs) Abuse in the States of Haryana, Maharashtra, U.P., Odisha, Tamil Nadu and Manipur.
- (vi) Evaluation of the scheme of Special Central Assistace to Scheduled Caste Sub Plan(SCA to SCSP) conducted by NIRD Hyderabad in 2012-1013.
- (vii) Evaluation of the scheme of Post Matric Matric Scholarship for SCs.

Scheme-wise Main Findings are given below.

- 1. Evaluation of Voluntary Organizations Working for the Welfare of SCs in the States of Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh and West Bengal.
- (i) The implementation of the scheme has resulted in increase of access to education, reduction in drop out rates, promoted vocational skills among target groups.
- (ii) Emphases should be made for opening more educational development projects in educationally backward blocks and sub-urban areas
- 2. Evaluation of Construction of Hostels for OBC Boys and Girls in the States of U.P., M.P. and Gujarat.

Majority (90%) of the inmates claimed that the scheme has considerably benefitted them in improvement of their educational status.

- 3. Evaluation of Composite Regional Centers (CRCs) for Persons with Disabilities.
- (i) There should be staying facility in every CRC for needy patients with nominal charges and hostel facility for outstation students.
- (ii) There is need to establish more than one CRC in bigger State and at least one in every State.

- 4. Evaluation of National Scheduled Castes Finance and Development Corporation (NSFDC).
- (i) The income of beneficiaries in services, production/manufacturing, agriculture & allied industry and purchase of equipments & machineries has increased by 27%, 30%, 40% and 55% respectively.
- (ii) Loan amounts should be increased from Rs.20,000/- to Rs.50,000/- for small investments of allied activities to encourage more and more individuals to start business relating to agriculture.
- (iii) The rate of interest on term loan scheme up to Rs. 5 lakh should not exceed 5% per annum.
- (iv) Online application system should be developed and all procedures pertaining to loan sanction and disbursement should be through appropriate computer software.
- 5. Evaluation of the effectiveness of Integrated Rehabilitation Centers for Addicts (IRCAs) getting grant-in-aid under the scheme of Assistance to Voluntary Oerganizations for Prevention of Alcoholism and Substance (Drugs) Abuse in the States of Haryana, Maharashtra, U.P., Odisha, Tamil Nadu and Manipur.
 - (i) IRCAs should focus on vocational training so that rehabilitated addicts could be easily employed or self employed.
 - (ii) Most of the residents (82.1%) have rated the quality of medical facilities available in IRCAs as very good.
 - (iii) Most of the residents (91.2%) felt that the care and support provided by IRCAs will help them in shaping their future to lead a normal life.
 - (iv) Majority of ex-addicts(79.7%) reported that care and support provided in the IRCAs during their stay helped very much in shaping their future.
 - 6. Evaluation of the scheme of Special Central Assistance to Scheduled Caste Subplan(SCA to SCSP) conducted by NIRD Hyderabad in 2012-1013.
 - (i) An increase in quantum of assistance to SC beneficiaries and to make it fully grant based.
 - (ii) To identify the financial gaps, which cannot be met from the SCSP allocation and SCA allocation should be used to fill that gap.
 - (iii) In order to make the scheme more attractive and economically viable, there is a need to enhance the subsidy on the lines of schemes such as Prime Minister Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), where the subsidy component for a SC beneficiary is upto 35% (in rural areas) of the project cost.

- (iv) SCA can be utilized optimally only in a situation of convergent implementation of the area based and family-oriented income generating schemes within the framework of the SCSP approach. In this regard, the SCA guidelines laying emphasis on utilization of the SCA in conjunction with the SCSP
- (v) should be made non-negotiable, compulsory, and the main criterion for release of the SCA.
- (vi) The SCSP strategy has not been as effective as it should have been mainly because of lack of adequate capacity at different level, lack of convergence of sectoral SCSP schemes. The resources under this scheme should be utilized to support the States/UTs in focusing on convergence of sectoral SCSP scheme, for formulation of new schemes directly and quantifiably benefitting the SCs, creation of comprehensive database for monitoring the implementation of SCSP on different parameters of social, educational and economic development of SCs.
- 7. The review of implementation of Post matric Scholarship to SC students, an inter Ministerial team led by NITI AAYOG in 2015 has visited various institutions in selected States to study the functioning of the scheme. The observations and recommendations of the team were considered by a Committee chaired by the Additional Secretary NITI AAYOG which has made recommendations on providing unique ID of students, Capping of tuition fees, Institutional mapping, periodical inspection of non-government institutions, verification of accounts of the state's claim etc

Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities.

1. Evaluation study of the SIPDA scheme

The Evaluation study of the SIPDA scheme was conducted by M/s.GFK Mode Pvt. Ltd. and the study report was submitted on 7.10.2015. The Agency recommended that the scheme has been found to be very beneficial to the target beneficiaries including students, tourists etc. It is strongly recommended that the SIPDA Scheme must be continued with added impetus in the next Plan period. The evaluation Study recommended for continuous implementation of the scheme. Also recommended that there is a need for definite guidelines and systems for effective and uniform scheme implementation across all geographies of the country. Scope of the scheme should be enlarged to cover Sections of the Act not implemented so far.

Main Findings of the scheme.

Based on the recommendations contained in the Study, the SIPDA scheme was formulated w.e.f. 28.1.2016. To enlarge the scope of the scheme, new activities like Skill Development Training Programme for Divyangjan under National Action Plan, Accessible India Campaign (Sugamya Bharat Abhiyan) as a nation wide flagship campaign for achieving universal accessibility to enable divyangjan to gain access for equal opportunity and live independently and participate fully in all aspects of life in an inclusive society, Unique Disability Identity project by development of application software and issue of Unique Disability Identity (UDID) Card and financial assistance for any other activity related to rehabilitation education, employment, accessibility and social security, specified in PwD Act, for which assistance is not being provided by any existing schemes have been included for funding under the Scheme. Under the Scheme, a committee has also been constituted to monitor various activities been funded under the scheme.

Annexure-VI

Annexure referred to in reply to Part (c)& (d) of Lok Sabha Starred question No.122 by Shri R. Goplakrishanan regarding Review of Central Sector/Centrally sponsored schemes

1.Free Coaching Scheme for SC and OBC students.

The Central Sector Scheme for Free Coaching for SC and OBC students has been revised with effect from 2016-17. In the revised scheme, apart from coaching for competitive examinations such as examinations conducted by UPSC and premier entrance examinations, coaching for eligibility tests like SAT, GRE and GMAT will also be included. In the revised scheme, reputed coaching institutions will be empanelled by a selection committee chaired by Additional Secretary, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment. The Ministry will fund the expenditure of coaching to selected SC/OBC candidates whose parental income from all sources is Rs.6 lakhs or less per annum. A monthly stipend of Rs.2500 per student will be paid for local students and Rs.5000 per student will be paid per month for outstation students.

2. Revision of IPOP Scheme

The IPOP Scheme being implemented since 1992 had been revised w.e.f 01.04.2008. Keeping in view the rise in cost of living index, they financial cost-norms of the scheme were revised w.e.f 01.04.2015. Thereafter, on the recommendations of the SFC for new Plan Schemes which were envisaged to be implemented during the Twelfth Plan, were merged with the relevant components of the IPOP Scheme. These merged Schemes are as under:-

- i) Awareness Generation for the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007.
- ii) Setting up of Helpline for Senior Citizens at National Level.
- iii) Setting up of Helpline for Senior Citizens at District Level.
- iv) Scheme for implementation of the New National Policy for Senior Citizens.
- 2.1 The Component of the IPOP relating to Maintenance of Old Age Home was amended to include those under Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojana (SAGY) also. The Component relating to "Any other activity which is considered suitable to meet the objectives of the scheme", was amended to include "Implementation of the provisions of National Policy for Senior Citizens (NPSrC).

2.2 The Scheme as revised has been notified w.e.f. 01.04.2016.

3.ADIP Scheme

The main objective of the Scheme for Assistance to Disabled Persons for Purchase/Fitting of Aids/Appliances (ADIP) is to provide grants-in-aid to the various implementing agencies (National Institutes/ Composite Regional Centres/Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of India (ALIMCO)/District Disability Rehabilitation Centres/State Handicapped Development Corporations/other local bodies/ NGOs) to assist the needy disabled persons in procuring durable, sophisticated and scientifically manufactured, modern, standard aids and appliances to promote physical, social and psychological rehabilitation of Persons with Disabilities by reducing the effects of disabilities and at the same time enhance their economic potential. The scheme also envisages conduct of corrective surgeries, whenever required, before providing an assistive device.

- 3.1 The Scheme has since been revised with effect from 1st April, 2014 and salient features thereof are:
- (i) Enhancement of income eligibility ceiling for 100% concession from the existing Rs. 6,500/- per month to Rs. 15,000/- per month and for a 50% concession from Rs. 15001/- to Rs. 20,000/- per month.
- (ii) To provide accessible mobile phone to visually impaired students of the age of 18 years and above only, once in five years and to provide laptop, Braille Note Taker and Brailler to school going disabled students (10th and above), once in 10 years.
- (iii) Cost ceiling for aids/appliances revised from Rs. 6000/- to Rs. 10,000/- for single disability and from Rs. 8,000/- to Rs. 12,000/- for Students with Disabilities.
- (iv) Ceiling of cost of medical/surgical correction which presently ranges from Rs. 500/- to Rs. 3,000/- revised as under:-
- (a) From Rs.500/- to Rs.1,000/- for hearing and speech impaired.
- (b) From Rs.1,000/- to Rs.2,000/- for visually disabled.
- (c) From Rs.3,000/- to Rs.5,000/- for orthopedically disabled.*

 *since revised from Rs.5000/- to Rs.10,000/- vide OM dated 18.07.2016.

- (v) Enhancing the extent of subsidy for motorized tricycles and wheelchairs from the present Rs. 6,000/- to Rs. 25,000/- for severely disabled and for locomotor disabilities such as Quadriplegic (SCI), Muscular Dystrophy, Stroke, Cerebral Palsy, Hemiplegia and any other person with similar conditions where either three/four
- (vii) limbs or one half of the body are severely impaired. This will be provided to the persons of age of 16 years and above, once in 10 years.
- vi) Provision for cochlear implant for 500 children per year with Hearing disability under the scheme, with a ceiling of Rs. 6.00 lakh per unit. Income ceiling for the beneficiaries will be the same i.e., up to Rs. 15,000/- per month for 100% concession and from Rs. 15001/- to Rs. 20,000/- per month for 50% concession.
- vii) Implementing agencies shall use 5% of the grant-in-aid as administrative/overhead expenses for conducting awareness, assessment and follow-up camps.
- (viii) Sample checking of 15% in case of grants-in-aid up to Rs.10/- lakh and and 10% in case of grants-in-aid exceeding Rs.10/- lakh.
- (ix) Under revised scheme Expert Committee/Core Groups were constituted to list out high end devices for all types of impairments. Based on the recommendation of the Expert Committee/ Core Groups lists of high end devices for distribution under the scheme have been notified.
- (x) Procedure for release of grant-in-aid has been simplified. Earlier provisions for furnishing list of identified beneficiaries, estimated expenditure for distribution of aids/devices and calendar of activities with dates for holding the camps have been deleted as Implementing Agencies are required to incur expenditure as per guidelines of the Scheme.
- (xi) It has also been made mandatory that all Implementing Agencies on receipt of grants-in-aid, should upload list of beneficiaries alongwith the complete details of beneficiaries (Ration Card/Adhar Card/Voter Identity Card) in their respective websites.
- (xii) For effective implementation of the Scheme and to ensure transparency the Government has taken the initiative like online submission of proposals by NGOs for availing grants-in-aid.
