**STATEMENT IN RESPECT OF PARTS (a) to (d) OF LOK SABHA STARRED
QUESTION NO. 24 TO BE ANSWERED ON 19/07/2016 REGARDING
“EXCHANGE PROGRAMME FOR FARMERS”**

(a) Yes, Madam. The work performance of Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs) is assessed every year. The achievements of major activities undertaken by KVKs during 2015-16 are given in **Annexure**.

(b) The Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) has established a network of 645 KVKs with a mandate for technology assessment and demonstration for its application and capacity development. As part of their activities the KVKs impart training to the farmers in various agricultural activities.

(c) & (d): The KVKs also organize exposure visits of farmers within and outside state. These visits facilitate interaction of farmers with the researchers, scientists, farm innovators, entrepreneurs, etc for getting ideas about the new technology/enterprise/products and enable them for cross learning. These visits also expose farmers to the latest technologies generated by Agricultural Universities and ICAR Institutes. It opens new horizons of knowledge to the farmers by “Seeing is believing” process. Besides, the discussions during visits among fellow farmers help in building confidence for adoption of new technologies offered to them.
