STATEMENT REFERRED IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) & (b) OF LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.*28 FOR 19.07.2016 REGARDING STOCK LIMIT FOR PULSES.

(a): Government has approved creation of buffer stock of 1.5 lakh tones of pulses in December, 2015. The proposal for enhancing this limit of 1.5 lakh tones of buffer stock is under consideration.

(b): Yes, Madam. Government would import pulses to improve domestic availability, the quantum of such import will depend on the availability and prices pulses both domestically and globally.
