# 1122. SHRI RAJESHBHAI CHUDASAMA

Will the Minister of Planning be pleased to state:

(a) the details of schemes that are transferred to States after devolution of 42 per cent of Central tax to States;

(b) the details of schemes that are jointly being implemented by States and the Centre and the schemes that are exclusively implemented by the Union Government;

(c) the details of amount that otherwise spent in the last three years by the Government on schemes transferred to States before devolution of 42 per cent of Central taxes to States, scheme, year and State-wise; and

(d) the manner in which the Government proposes that States would spend substantially on schemes transferred to them even though 42 per cent is given to them?

(a) & (b): In the budgetary provision for 2015-16, existing Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSSs) have been classified into four categories as mentioned below:

Category-A: Centrally Sponsored Schemes placed in this category are proposed to be implemented with central support (without change in funding pattern) - (17 existing CSSs).

Category-B: Funding pattern of Centrally Sponsored Schemes placed in this category are proposed to be changed - (33 existing CSSs).

Category-C: Centrally Sponsored Schemes placed in this category are delinked from union support and States may decide to continue from their own resources- (8 existing CSSs).

Category-D: Schemes placed in this category are part of devolution to the States or have been restructured and amalgamated among schemes in Category A, B or C - (8 existing CSSs). Relevant extract of the budgetary provision for 2015-16 is enclosed at Annexure-I.

(c) to (e): As stated above, 8 Centrally Sponsored Schemes were delinked from support from the Centre along with greater devolution of 42% to the States as per the recommendations of the 14<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission. The Centrally Sponsored Schemes were further restructured in the Union Budget 2016-17 based on the recommendations of the Report of the "Sub-Group of Chief Ministers on Rationalization of Centrally Sponsored Schemes", submitted in October 2015. State-wise funds transferred under Central Assistance to State Plan (CASP) for the Financial Years 2013-14, 2014-15 & 2015-16 are given at Annexure-II.
