Free Education in Government Schools

†1326. SHRIMATI VEENA DEVI:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government proposes to make a provision for imparting free education to students upto 10th standard in all the Government schools in the country;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

- (c) whether the Government has formulated any action plan to implement the said decision; and
- (d) if so, the blue print of the said plan and the time by which it would be implemented?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI UPENDRA KUSHWAHA)

(a) to (d): The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009 provides for free and compulsory education to every child of the age of six to fourteen years in a neighbourhood school till completion of elementary education. The Central Advisory Board of Education (CABE) in its 63rd meeting held on 19th August, 2015 decided to reconstitute the Sub-Committee on 'Extension of Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009 to Secondary Education'. Accordingly, the Sub-Committee has been reconstituted on the 4th April, 2016 and modified by order dated 27th May, 2016.
