DEVELOPMENT OF NEW PORT

Will the Minister of SHIPPING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government proposes to develop Enayam Port near Colachel in Tamil Nadu and if so, the details and the objectives thereof;
- (b) whether the new port has been proposed in the region of already well-established ports of Tuticorin, Cochin, Vallarpadam and Vizhinjam etc. and if so, the reaction of the Government in this regard;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to deepen the Palk Strait at Sethusamudram in order to enhance the utility of the proposed port and if so, the details thereof;
- (d) whether the operation of the proposed port would require construction of at least two breakwaters and if so, the details thereof;
- (e) the extent to which the proposed port is likely to compete with the Colombo Port under the East West sea trade routes; and
- (f) the mode of execution proposed for development of the proposed port?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SHIPPING
(SHRI PON. RADHAKRISHNAN)

- (a) Yes, Madam. The objective is to develop a deep sea Transshipment Port at Colachel (Enayam), very close to the great East-West Shipping route.
- (b) The proposed Port at Enayam is not likely to affect the business of these ports, instead these Ports in the region will form a cluster in the Southern part of Indian Sub-continent.
- (c) The matter is subjudice.
- (d) Yes Madam. As per the Techno-Economic Feasibility Report, the Port layout consist breakwaters of total length of 8904m (Phase-1: 4639m, Phase-2: 2598m & Phase-3:1667m) in the combination of rubble mound and vertical breakwaters.
- (e) The New Major Port at Enayam will work out strategies in operation and pricing to overcome the challenges of Colombo Port.
- (f) The Port is proposed to be executed through investment by Government and PPP Mode.
