ASSESSMENT OF NHM

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has assessed the performance of National Health Mission (NHM) in tribal and remote areas, if so, the details thereof and outcome thereon; and
- (b) the details of financial and technical support provided to States to strengthen their health systems including for setting up/upgrading public health facilities and improving healthcare particularly in tribal areas during each of the last three years and the current year, State/UT-wise including High Priority Districts (HPDs) of Jharkhand?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI FAGGAN SINGH KULASTE)

(a): The working of National Health Mission (NHM) is reviewed/assessed inter-alia through external surveys such as, National Family Health Survey (NFHS), District Level Household Survey (DLHS), Annual Health Survey (AHS) and Sample Registration System (SRS). NFHS-4 Survey is presently ongoing. Further, Common Review Missions (CRMs) also undertake a review of NRHM/NHM every year. All the above surveys and review cover tribal and remote areas also.

(b): The State/UT-wise information (including High Priority Districts (HPDs) of Jharkhand and tribal areas) related to approvals and utilization under the activities of "Hospital strengthening and new constructions/renovation and setting up" under NHM for the last three years is at Annexure. For the current year 2016-17, approvals are under finalization.

Under NHM, HPDs receive higher per capita funding, enhanced monitoring and focused supportive supervision. Further, the States are encouraged to adopt innovative approaches to address the peculiar health challenges of HPDs and Special Focus Districts (SFDs) (all tribal districts that are not HPDs). Technical support from all sources is being harmonised and aligned with NHM particularly in these districts to support implementation of key priority intervention packages.
