EXCLUSION FROM NCDEX

Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- the details of items traded in National Commodity and Derivatives Exchange Limited (NCDEX);
- whether the Government intends to separate gram, which is an essential food item from NCDEX business, if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor; and
- the time by which it will be done?

- (a) Currently, futures contract on following commodities are being traded on National Commodity and Derivatives Exchange Limited (NCDEX):

(b) & (c) There is no proposal under consideration of the Government to separate gram (Chana) from NCDEX business. However, keeping in view the demand and supply gap as reflected in the price trend in Chana and the supply constraints in near term, the Securities and Exchange Board of India has, as a temporary regulatory measure, issued following directions to commodity derivatives exchanges on June 16, 2016:

- Not to launch any new Chana futures contracts till further orders; and
- To permit only squaring up (closing) of open positions in case of already running Chana futures contracts.

As a result, currently, future contracts on Chana expiring only in August, 2016, September, 2016 and October, 2016 are available on NCDEX for trading, wherein participants can only square up existing positions and cannot create fresh positions.
