ACHIEVEMENTS OF AYUSH

**2215. SHRI RAYAPATI SAMBASIVA RAO:
SHRI JAYADEV GALLA:**

Will the Minister of **AYURVEDA, YOGA AND NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMOEOPATHY (AYUSH)** be pleased to state:

- (a) the targets fixed and major achievements made in the field of AYUSH by the Ministry during the last two years and the current year, State/UT-wise;
- (b) the funds earmarked, released and unutilized during the said period, year and stream-wise;
- (c) the reasons for under-achievement, if any, came across in obtaining the set targets during the period;
- (d) the details of core areas in which the Government is going to focus in the coming years; and
- (e) the other initiatives taken for development, expansion and spreading awareness of AYUSH systems of medicine during the said period?

**ANSWER
THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYURVEDA,

- (a): State/UT wise targets cannot be fixed since the funds to be released depend on various considerations including Utilisation Certificates etc and the implementing agencies are other than Ministry of AYUSH. However, major achievements made in the field of AYUSH by the Ministry during the last two years and the current year are furnished at **Annexure- A**.
- (b): The funds earmarked , released and unutilized during the said period, year and stream-wise are furnished at **Annexure-B**.
- (c): The reasons for under-achievements includes non-receipt of proposals, receipt of incomplete proposals, non-utilisation of funds in earlier years.
- (d): The core areas of activities of Ministry of AYUSH includes Research and Development, Education, Regulations, Promotion and creating awareness in the steams of Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Siddha and Homoeopathy including Sowa Rigpa in India and other countries.

(e): The Ministry has planned to establish an All India Institute of Homoeopathy at New Delhi and an All India Institute of Unani Medicine at Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh.

The Ministry has taken various initiatives for development , expansion and spreading awareness of AYUSH systems of medicines through various Central Sector Schemes viz. Information, Education and Communication(IEC), Public Health Initiative (PHI), Centre of Excellence (COE), Research Councils, National Institutes etc. and Centrally Sponsored Scheme viz. National AYUSH Mission(NAM).

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS MADE IN THE FIELD OF AYUSH BY THE MINISTRY DURING THE LAST TWO YEARS AND THE CURRENT YEAR

1. RESEARCH COUNCILS

- i) The Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences (CCRAS) have filed patent for four products and Central Council for Research in Unani Medicine (CCRUM) have filed patent for two products to obtain patent/commercialise of their product.
- ii) Recently, for the management of diabetes mellitus, the Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences(CCRAS) has developed a formulation namely, AYUSH-82 from 05 Ayurvedic medicinal plants.
- iii) In addition to its research work, the 81 institutes under the CCRAS also provide healthcare facilities. In order to converge the research approach existing in AYUSH system with the modern system of medicine, the Ministry of AYUSH during 2015-16, has completed preliminary deliberation with Indian Council for Medical Research (ICMR) and has provided specific leads to them to enable molecular based study.
- iv) The CCRH through its programme namely, Homoeopathy for Healthy Child have enrolled 40,000 children which would help them during dentition period and treatment of disease. Their programme related to Swastha Rakshan under CCRH has benefitted an estimated 1,12,000 patients.
- v) In addition to Projects undertaken as Intra Mural Research and collaborative research by all the Councils, during 2015-16, the Councils initiated several programmes with support from the modern system of medicines.

2. NATIONAL INSTITUTES

The three new Institutes namely, All India Institute of Ayurveda(AIIA), New Delhi, North Eastern Institute of Ayurveda and Homoeopathy(NEIAH), Shillong and North Eastern Institute of Folk Medicine(NEIFM), Pasighat are complete and these Institutes are to be operationalised during the current year.

3. CENTRAL SECTOR SCHEME OF PROMOTION OF INFORMATION, EDUCATION & COMMUNICATION (IEC).

- i) The Ministry has been celebrating the International Day of Yoga during the last two years with an aim to help people to adopt healthy way of life. Two Guinness World Records were achieved, viz the Largest Yoga Lesson involving 35,985 participants and Maximum number of Nationalities (84) participated in a single yoga lesson during the celebration of 1st International Day of Yoga, 2015. A two-day International Conference was also held as a part of the celebration.

ii) The Ministry organised 13 National Level AROGYA Fairs, 08 State Level AROGYA Fairs, participated in 24 AYUSH based Fairs/Melas Exhibitions, provided financial assistance to 28 NGOs/Institutes for organising Workshops/Seminars etc. and provided reimbursement to 243 AYUSH Industries for participation in Fairs organized by Central/State Govt. for the promotion and propagation of AYUSH.

4. INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

i) The Joint Statement was issued during the visit of President of USA, 25-27 January, 2015 to India " - " – "Shared Effort; Progress for All", Para 33 addressed the issue of Traditional Medicine stating that the Prime Minister and the President agreed to expand the India-U.S. Health Initiative into a Healthcare Dialogue with relevant stakeholders to further strengthen bilateral collaboration in health sectors including through capacity building initiatives and by exploring new areas, including complementary and traditional medicine. The President and the Prime Minister pledged to encourage dialogue between the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and its Indian counterparts on traditional medicine. The Leaders also pledged to strengthen collaboration, dialogue, and cooperation between the regulatory authorities of the two countries to ensure safety, efficacy, and quality of pharmaceuticals, including generic medicines.

ii) An India-Canada Joint Statement: **“New Vigour, New Steps”** was issued on 15th April, 2015, wherein, besides others, the Hon’ble Prime Ministers agreed to establish a dialogue between relevant federal departments of the two countries in order to facilitate cooperation in the field of traditional medicine.

iii) As a first breakthrough in a European University an Ayurveda Chair was setup by the Ministry of AYUSH at University of Debrecen in Hungary.

iv) Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) on Country to Country Cooperation in the field of Traditional Systems of Medicine were signed with five countries namely Bangladesh, Nepal, Mauritius, Mongolia and Turkmenistan.

v) Three MoUs on Cooperation in the field Traditional Medicine were signed with various Institutions.

vi) MoUs for setting up Academic Chair in Ayurveda were signed with Government of the Republic of India and Udayana University, Bali, Indonesia on 4th November, 2015; Peoples’ Friendship University, Russia on 24th December, 2015; University of Primorska, Republic of Slovenia on 10th March, 2016, Rangsit University, Thailand on 9th June, 2015, Yerevan State Medical University (YSMU), Armenia on 9th April, 2016.

vii) The World Ayurveda Congress (WAC) was organized by the Ministry of AYUSH in collaboration with World Ayurveda Foundation and Government of NCT of Delhi during 7-9 November, 2014 at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi.

viii) 11 AYUSH Information Cells were set up to disseminate authentic information about AYUSH Systems of Medicine at Slovenia, Sweden, China, Dubai, Croatia, Kyrgyzstan, Finland, Argentina, Serbia, Israel and Tajikistan.

ix) An “India-China College of Yoga” has been established in the Yunnan Minzu University, China under the MoU signed between the University and the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR).

x) To ensure credibility of knowledge and skills of Yoga experts, a Scheme for Voluntary Certification of Yoga Professionals has been launched on 22nd June, 2015, during the Valedictory Session of the “International Conference on Yoga for Holistic Health”.

xi) A two day India-US Workshop on Traditional Medicine was organised at New Delhi on 3-4 March, 2016 in association with DHHS, US Embassy, New Delhi. Ambassador Richard Verma, US Embassy, New Delhi and Ambassador Kolker, Assistant Secretary, DHHS graced the Inaugural session. The invited US delegates from Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), National Institute of Health, National Cancer Institute deliberated with the eminent experts from India with expertise in Cancer research and other promising areas for two days to share experiences and work out a road map for future collaborations.

xii) The Ministry of AYUSH supported the organization of ‘International Convention on World Homoeopathy Day’, on 9-10 April, 2016 at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi organized jointly by the Central Council for Research in Homoeopathy (CCRH) and *Liga Medicorum Homoeopathica Internationalis* (LMHI).

xiii) A Project Collaboration Agreement was signed between Ministry of AYUSH and World Health Organisation (WHO), Hqs, Geneva on 13th May, 2016. Under the agreement benchmarks would be developed for training in Yoga and practice in Ayurveda, Unani and *Panchkarma*. The long term collaboration with WHO would help in improving international acceptability and promotion of AYUSH systems.

5. CENTRALLY SPONSORED SCHEME OF NATIONAL AYUSH MISSION (NAM)

Under Centrally Sponsored Scheme of National AYUSH Mission (NAM) grant-in-aid is being provided to State/UT Governments for development and promotion of Ayurveda, Yoga & Naturopathy Unani, Siddha and Homoeopathy (AYUSH) as per their proposed State Annual Action Plans (SAAPs). Since, implementation of the programme comes under the purview of State/UT Governments, no target has been fixed by Govt. of India, State/UT-wise. However, funds have been released to the States/UTs for their eligible proposals under National AYUSH Mission. The status of fund released during last two years and the current year, State/UT-wise is furnished at **Appendix-I**.

6. NATIONAL MEDICINAL PLANTS BOARD

- viii) Developed Standardisation of Good Agricultural Practices and Good Field Collection Practices
- ix) Demand and Supply Study of Medicinal Plants

7. EDUCATION POLICY (INDIAN MEDICINE)

- a) During the academic session 2014-15, total 104 Letter of Intent were issued to the applicant, applied in 2013. Out of which 103 Letter of Permission were issued and 01 Letter of Intent was withdrawn. The permissions granted as per the provisions of section 13A of the Indian Medicine Central Council (IMCC) Act, 1970 is as follows -
- i. to establish 19 new Ayurveda colleges with total 1240 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 02 new Unani colleges with total 160 seats in UG (BUMS) course,
 - ii. to increase the admission capacity by 695 UG (BAMS) seats & 32 PG seats in the existing 39 Ayurveda colleges and by 60 UG (BUMS) seats in existing 03 Unani Colleges, and
 - iii. to open new Post-Graduate Courses in existing 31 Ayurveda colleges with 548 PG seats and in 01 Unani College with 09 PG seats.

- b) The permission for the period not exceeding five years was accorded to 23 Ayurveda colleges from the academic session 2014-15 and conditional permission was accorded for the academic session 2014-15 to 230 Ayurveda colleges, 41 Unani colleges and 09 Siddha colleges.
- c) During the academic session 2015-16, total 114 Letter of Intent were issued to the applicant, applied in 2014. Out of which 113 Letter of Permission were issued and 01 Letter of Intent was withdrawn. The permissions granted as per the provisions of section 13A of the Indian Medicine Central Council (IMCC) Act, 1970 is as follows -
 - i. to establish 16 new Ayurveda colleges with total 1220 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 02 new Unani colleges with total 120 seats in UG (BUMS) course,
 - ii. to increase the admission capacity by 885 UG (BAMS) seats & 79 PG seats in the existing 47 Ayurveda colleges and by 80 UG (BUMS) seats in existing 05 Unani Colleges, and
 - iii. to open new Post-Graduate Courses in existing 32 Ayurveda colleges with 493 PG seats and in 04 Unani College with 27 PG seats.
- d) the permission for the period not exceeding five years was accorded to 28 Ayurveda colleges & 05 Unani College from the academic session 2015-16 and conditional permission was accorded for the academic session 2015-16 to 190 Ayurveda colleges, 38 Unani colleges and 09 Siddha colleges.
- e) The permission for the period not exceeding five years was accorded to 23 Ayurveda colleges from the academic session 2014-15, out of which permission for the period not exceeding five years of 01 Ayurveda college was withdrawn and conditional permission for the academic session 2015-16 was accorded.

8. EDUCATION POLICY (HOMOEOPATHY)

The Central Government has granted permission to start ten new Homoeopathy Colleges and upgraded eight Homoeopathy Medical Colleges to start new Post Graduate Courses and five Colleges have been permitted to increase admission capacity as per the provision of Section 12A of the Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 during the last three years.
