#### IAS/IPS OFFICERS ON TRAINING

Ä2809. SHRIMATI SAKUNTALA LAGURI:

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Indian Administrative Service (IAS) and Indian Police Service (IPS) officers who got training in foreign countries during the last three years and the number of the said officers out of above belonging to the scheduled castes and scheduled tribes; and
- (b) the criteria and reasons for sending them abroad for training?

### **ANSWER**

Minister of State in the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions and Minister of State in the Prime Minister & Office. (DR. JITENDRA SINGH)

(a) & (b): Department of Personnel and Training seeks nominations of eligible officers every year from various Ministries/Departments/State Governments for long term and short term fully funded foreign training programme under the scheme of Domestic Funding of Foreign Training. The schemes aims at capacity building of officers by giving them cross country exposure on the developments in governance.

The nominations received are examined as per established norms by the Department and officers are selected for foreign training. In a scale of 100, weightage is given to various parameters for long term and short term programmes which are as under:
