Will the Minister of **RURAL DEVELOPMENT** be pleased to state:

- (a) the present status of implementation of Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana (SAGY);
- (b) whether the Government has directed the industries to use their Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funding for SAGY;
- (c) if so, the details along with the response from the industries thereto; and
- (d) if not, the reasons therefor?

(a): The present status of implementation of Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana (SAGY) is given in Annexure I.

(b) to (d): No Madam,

Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana envisages development of Adarsh Grams out of people's shared vision, using their capacities and available resources to the extent possible, duly facilitated by the Members of Parliament, the Gram Panchayat, Civil Society and the Government machinery. The development is intended to take place through converging resources from Central Sector, Centrally Sponsored and State schemes. In pursuance of this, the relevant Ministries/ Departments of the Central Government have made changes in 21 of their Programme/Scheme guidelines to give priority to the Gram Panchayats identified under Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana.

Further, as per the clause 12 A of the Guidelines of the SAGY, Members of Parliament would facilitate in mobilizing additional resources to the extent possible, particularly from CSR and philanthropies.

Charge Officers Training

The Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD), under the Comprehensive Capacity Building Plan, has organised training programmes for 653 Charge Officers at 9 regional locations across India.

Considering the need to orient the Charge Officers on various approaches and steps of Participatory planning and mobilizing the resources, the capacity building manual has been prepared under the name 'SAMARTHYA – SAGY'. The manual contains 6 Modules focused on the thematic areas 'Overview on SAGY, Frame work for VDP in SAGY, Situation Analysis, Participatory Planning Processes and Strategies, Resource Envelope and Convergence possibilities, MIS of SAGY and VDP Tracking'. The 'SAMARTHYA – SAGY' was released on 1st April, 2015, by Hon'ble Minister of Rural Development and is available online.

Changes in Guidelines

As per the Cabinet decision, the Ministry of Rural Development is pursuing with relevant Ministries and Departments for effecting amendments and issuing appropriate advisories in order to enable priority to be given to the SAGY Panchayats. 21 Schemes have been amended by various Ministries /Departments. The details are as under;

National Level Committee

The National Level Committee headed by Minister, Rural Development including 16 Ministers and 6 Members of Parliament has been notified on 7th May, 2015. The Committee met on 5th June, 2015 and suggestions were taken on further improvement in the implementation process.

The National Level Committee headed by Secretary, Rural Development including representatives of 20 Central Ministries / Departments has been constituted and notified on 08.12.2014. The meeting of the Committee was held on 15th May, 2015 to streamline various schemes of Govt. of India for SAGY.

Regular State Review

The implementation of the Programme is being reviewed by the Minister (RD) through meetings with the Hon'ble Members of Parliament, District Collectors and State Government officials at regional locations. So far reviews have taken place in respect of 18 States. Details of completed review meetings are as under;

Online Village Development Plan system

A Village Development Plan (VDP) has been prepared for every identified Gram Panchayat with special focus on enabling every poor household to come out of poverty. In order to keep track of the progress of implementation of VDP, a Village Development Plan Tracking Template has been developed. In this format, the 'Area of Work' to be undertaken for development should be identified and categorised sector wise. Each such 'Area of Work' should be mapped with the various Schemes of Govt. of India /State Govt. along with line departments who are responsible for the activity. As the project is strictly time bound, each such activity should have clear stipulated and realistic timelines and priority. Though VDP can include as many segment of improvement /development, only such 'Area of Work' should be chosen which can be completed within the timeframe laid down under SAGY. Till now VDPs have been prepared for 644 GPs.

SAMANVAY

The Ministry of Rural Development has brought out "SAMANVAY" - Compilation of 223 Central sector, Centrally sponsored and 1806 State schemes for convergence under SAGY.

Sankalan

The Members of Parliament have proactively initiated and led various innovative and path-breaking development initiatives in their respective Gram Panchayats with the active participation and co-operation of many developmental partners including the Government, Civil society, CSR and most importantly, the respective communities for the holistic development of villages. A consolidated 101 good development initiatives undertaken by the Hon'ble MPs in their respective constituencies across the country have been compiled in a book and released under the name "SANKALAN" by Minister of Rural Development on 23rd September, 2015.

Panchayat Darpan

The Ministry has developed a 35 point indicators as "Panchayat Darpan" to monitor the progress of the SAGY Gram Panchayats. The progress of work for different sector specific interventions will be captured and updated on quarterly, half yearly and yearly basis. Till now 541 GPs have updated date on website. E-Book

In line with Digital India Mission by the government, the book 'SANKALAN' was also launched in an 'e-Book' format by Minister of Rural Development during the Good Practices workshop held at Bhopal on 23rd September, 2015. The good development initiatives undertaken by Hon'ble Members of Parliaments will act as a catalyst in the positive motivation towards developing adarsh grams. Bhopal Workshop

It is well known that many successful micro-level initiatives and developmental practices exist across the length and breadth of Rural India. More often however, lack of reliable documentation keeps them in silos. It was in this scenario that Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) decided to research and document 'Good Practices in the Rural Development Sector' so that they can be brought into mainstream deliberation and wider adaptation under Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana.

A National Workshop was organised on 23rd-24th September, 2015 at Bhopal by MoRD, where Members of Parliament, State Governments, District Collectors, Gram Pradhans from across all States were invited. The selected Good Practices by National Level Committee of the Ministry of Rural Development were presented through 2 days' detailed exhibition so that similar good practices could be adopted in SAGY Gram Panchayats. Not only 22 Government entries but 39 Private and 21 Community based Organisations were selected as good practices for dissemination.

Provision of 100% saturation of Basic Services

Ministry of Rural Development is in dialogue with four key Ministries to provide 100% saturation of basic services like water, electricity, roads and education in the SAGY GPs
