- (a) whether the growth in passenger traffic has pushed the revenues of Airports Authority of India (AAI) past a record Rs.10,000 crore mark in 2015-16, helping it clock a robust growth in its net profit;
- (b) if so, the details thereof including the various factors that led to such a high revenue earned by AAI;
- (c) the details of revenue and profit registered by AAI during the last three years and the current year, year and sector-wise;
- (d) whether higher passenger traffic, user development fee, passenger service fee on air tickets have contributed to such high revenue of AAI; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

- (a) & (b): Yes Madam. There is increase in the passenger traffic by 18%, in aircraft movements by 11% and in airport lease revenue by 16.23% for the year 2015-16 over 2014-15. These have contributed to AAI's robust growth in its net profit.
- (c): Details are at Annexure-I.
- (d) & (e): Increase in passenger numbers, marginal increase of User Development Fee (UDF) charges in AAI airports, Passenger Service Fee (Facilitation Component) and increase in lease revenue from Delhi and Mumbai airports have contributed to the increase in AAI revenues. Details are as under:
