#### SCHEMES FOR SCHOOL GOING TRIBAL STUDENTS

3600. SHRI PINAKI MISRAV: PROF. RICHARD HAY:

Will the Minister of TRIBAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the number/percentage of school going children in the tribal areas in the country, State/UT- wise;
- (b) whether the number /percentage of school going children in the tribal areas in the country has increased over the years;
- (c) if so, the details thereof, State/UT wise and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (d) the steps taken by the Government to promote primary education amongst tribals;
- (e) the details of various schemes run by the Government in this regard including providing food and medical check-ups of tribal Students; and
- (f) the funds allocated for the purpose during each of the last three years and the current year, State/UT-wise?

#### **ANSWER**

### MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TRIBAL AFFAIRS (SHRI JASWANTSINH SUMANBHAI BHABHOR)

- (a) to (c): State/UT-wise details of number/percentage of school going Scheduled Tribe (ST) children are given at **Annexure-I**. Percentage of school going ST children in the age group 7-14 and 15-19 years in the country has increased from 62.9% in 2001 to 81.0% in 2011 and from 30.5% in 2001 to 43.7% in 2011, respectively. Data pertaining to Census 2001 and 2011 show that there has been increase in percentage of school going ST children in the age group 7-14 and 15-19 years, in all States / UTs. Details are given at **Annexure-I**.
- (d) to (f): Ministry of Tribal Affairs supplements the efforts of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, which is the line Ministry with regard to the subject of education, and the State Governments / UT Administrations by administering various schemes for enhancing access to primary education through provision of infrastructure by way of construction of hostels for ST students, establishment of Ashram Schools and through a scheme, namely, 'Strengthening Education among Scheduled Tribe Girls in Low Literacy Districts' for educational upliftment

of ST girls. Details of funds released under these schemes during 2013-14 to 2016-17 are given at **Annexure-II**.

Ministry of Women & Child Development is administering Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) Scheme which is a centrally sponsored scheme being implemented by State Governments / UT Administrations. The scheme aims at holistic development of children, including ST children, below 6 years of age and pregnant women & lactating mothers, by providing a package of six services comprising; (i) Supplementary nutrition; (ii) Pre-school non-formal education; (iii) Nutrition and Health Education; (iv) Immunization; (v) Health check-up; and (vi) Referral services through Anganwadi Centres at grassroots level. Three of the six services, namely, immunization, health check-up and referral services are related to health and are provided by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare through National Health Mission (NHM) & Public Health Infrastructure.

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, under National Health Mission is implementing Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK) for screening of all children, including ST children, from 0-18 years of age including school children for 4 D's i.e. Defects, Deficiencies, Diseases, and Development delays including disability. The School Health Programme is subsumed under Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram. Under Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram, children in age group of birth till 6 years are screened twice a year at Anganwadi Centres and children of 6 to 18 years, enrolled in Government and Government aided schools are screened once a year by dedicated Mobile Block Health Teams consisting of two Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha and Homoeopathy (AYUSH) doctors (one male and one female), Auxiliary Nurse Midwife (ANM) and one pharmacist. At present 32 States / UTs of the country are implementing this initiative. Details of Sate / UT wise financial approvals for RBSK programme during 2013-14 to 2015-16 are given at Annexure-III.
