- (d)&(e): Project proposals are received from various State Governments and Central Line Ministries, who appraise and prioritize the same and recommend it to the Department of Economic Affairs for posing the projects to the concerned external agency. Funding Pattern

1. World Bank Assisted Projects

As a general rule, for State Sector Projects upto 70% of project cost is funded by the MDBs, and for Central sector projects, 50% of the project cost can be financed by through the MDB loan. The specific funding pattern is stipulated in the respective loan/ financing agreements.

2. <u>JICA Projects - Normally, maximum 85% of the project cost is allowed by JICA as ODA loan.</u>
