(a) & (b) Yes Madam. The Regional Centre for Biotechnology Bill 2016 was introduced as part of agreement with UNESCO regarding establishment of the Regional Centre for Biotechnology Training and Education in India to serve the members countries of UNESCO.

The Lok Sabha & Rajya Sabha passed The Regional Centre for Biotechnology Bill, 2016 during Budget session (March, 2016) & Monsoon session (July, 2016) respectively. Gazette notification for the Regional Centre for Biotechnology Act, 2016 No. 36 of 2016 has been published on 30th July, 2016.

(c) & (d) The Government has approved an Expenditure Finance Committee (EFC) proposal with an initial cost of Rs.99.55 crores for 5 years in 2009 for setting up Regional Centre for Biotechnology (RCB). Thereafter, the Centre has been supported by annual financial support in the form of Grants-in-aid.
