Will the Minister of CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is considering to collaborate with the Central Public Sector Undertakings for revival of fertilizer plants in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of fertilizer plants presently under consideration of the Government for revival under such collaboration; and
- (d) the steps taken for revival of those plants which are left out?

(a) to (d): The Union Cabinet in its meeting held on 13.07.2016 has approved to revive three defunct fertilizer units, namely Gorakhpur, Sindri units of the Fertilizer Corporation of India Limited (FCIL) and Barauni unit of Hindustan Fertilizer Corporation Limited (HFCL), by means of Special Purpose Vehicle of Public Sector Units (PSUs) namely, National Thermal Power Corporation, Coal India Limited (CIL), Indian Oil Corporation Limited and FCIL/HFCL, through nomination route.

. Talcher is being revived by Rashtriya Chemicals & Fertilizers Limited, Gail (India) Ltd, CIL and FCIL and Ramagundam is being revived by National Fertilizers Limited, Engineers India Limited and FCIL.
