Will the Minister of URBAN DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of proposals received by the Government from various States for selection of cities to be developed as Smart Cities, State-wise;
- (b) the details of cities selected so far, State-wise and the criteria for selection along with the time by which other cities are likely to be selected;
- (c) the manner in which the funds have been generated or is being generated for Smart Cities and the details of funds provided to

these cities so far, city-wise along with the funding pattern in this regard;

- (d) the details of projects taken up or are likely to be taken up in selected cities, city-wise along with the details of role assigned to local bodies/municipalities for development of Smart Cities; and
- (e) the time period for development of selected Smart Cities?

ANSWER

- (a)& (b): 98 cities were shortlisted as potential Smart Cities on the basis of an intra-state competition conducted by the State Governments. Out of these 98 potential smart cities, 20 cities were selected in Round 1 (Annexure-I). Further, to spread the message of urban transformation across the country, another 23 cities located in non-represented states/UTs, were also provided an opportunity to submit their upgraded proposal for consideration on fast track basis. Out of these 23 cities, 13 cities have been selected in fast track round(Annexure-2).

63 potential Smart Cities have since submitted their upgraded Smart City Proposals (SCPs) for participation in Round 2. These SCPs are being evaluated by a Panel of Experts. Results are likely to be announced in August 2016.

The selection in the All India Competition is based on (i) City wide Criteria, (ii) Area Based Development Criteria, and (iii) Pan-City Solution Criteria. The sub-criteria used include Vision and goals, Key Performance Indicators, Smartness of proposal, Citizen Engagement, process followed, etc.

- (c): Government of India will provide financial support of the extent of Rs. 48,000 crore over five years i.e. on an average Rs. 100 crore per smart city per year. An equal amount on a matching basis will have to be contributed by the State/Urban

Local Body (ULB). These contributions, however, will meet only a part of the project cost and balance funds as required by the city in terms of their Smart City Proposals are expected to be mobilised from internal and external sources, such as land monetization, market borrowings, Public Private Partnerships, Pooled financed mechanism, municipal bonds etc.

An advance of Rs. 196 cr. @ Rs. 2 cr. per city was allocated initially to all the 98 potential smart cities for preparation of Smart City Proposals (SCPs) (Annexure-3). In addition, Rs. 3293 cr. has been released to 17 Smart Cities which have formed Special Purpose Vehicles (SPVs) to implement their projects (Annexure-4). Remaining Cities will get Central Government funding once their SPVs are established.

(d)&(e):The implementation of the Smart Cities Mission is to be done by the Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) created at the city level for the purpose. After establishment of SPVs, Project Management Consultants (PMCs) have to be procured to convert the Smart City Proposals (SCPs) to Projects. The details of projects with their timelines for the Smart Cities are different and are given in their SCPs which are on the smart city website ([www.smartcities.gov.in](http://www.smartcities.gov.in)) . Presently, SPVs are in the process of procuring the PMCs and the projects have been planned by the Smart Cities to be completed by 2020.
