STRENGTH OF BUREAUCRATS

637. SHRIMATI V. SATHYA BAMA:
SHRI PR. SENTHIL NATHAN:

Will the **PRIME MINISTER** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has taken any decision on the cadre sanctioned strength of IAS and IPS officers in the country, State-wise;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the recruitments made during the last three years, year-wise and cadre-wise;
- (c) the steps taken by the Government to direct State Governments to fill up adequate IAS and IPS officers in their respective States from their State Government Services in the coming years; and
- (d) the total expenditure incurred by the central exchequer for the overall expenditure of IAS and IPS officers in the country, State-wise?

ANSWER

Minister of State in the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions and Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office. (DR. JITENDRA SINGH)

(a) & (b): The Sanctioned strength of the India Administrative Service (IAS) and Indian Police Service (IPS) officers of any given cadre is reviewed ordinarily at the interval of every five years. Cadre-wise details of officers allocated to IAS and IPS on the basis of Civil Services Examination- 2012 to 2014 are at Annexure-I and Annexure-II respectively.

(c): The appointment by promotion to IAS/IPS from State Civil Service/ State Police Service is governed by the statutory provisions, which envisage separate role to Central Government, State Governments and Union Public Service Commission (UPSC). The vacancies to be filled up are determined year wise and selection committee meetings are conducted by the UPSC for preparation of select list on receipt of the proposals from the State Governments/UTs. Periodic meetings are conducted by the UPSC and Central Government with the State Governments to expedite the proposals for the Selection Committee Meetings so that the vacancies are filled up expeditiously.

(d): The information regarding total expenditure incurred by the central exchequer for the overall expenditure of IAS and IPS officers in the country, State-wise is not maintained.
