STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (c) OF LOK SABHA UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 960 FOR ANSWER ON 22.7.2016

It has been the constant endeavor of the Government to make Short Service Commission (SSC) more attractive. These include extending time based promotion to the substantive rank of Captain, Major and Lieutenant Colonel after 2, 6 and 13 years of reckonable service respectively to SSC officers, increase in tenure of SSC officers from 10 years to 14 years, grant of re-employment to SSC officers after 14 years of service.

Additional proposals for making SSC more attractive including measures to increase monetary benefits have been taken up for inter-departmental consultations:
