ACTIVITIES OF SWASTH NARI, SASHAKT PARIVAR

1060 # SHRI B K PARTHASARATHI:

Will the **MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the activities conducted under the Swasth Nari, Sashakt Parivar Abhiyan, especially in Andhra Pradesh;
- (b) the details of the funds allocated and disbursed by the Central Government for the implementation of the campaign, State/UT-wise;
- (c) the number of health camps/facilities established, classified State-wise and district-wise including Andhra Pradesh;
- (d) the number of beneficiaries screened and number of the diseases diagnosed through such screenings, classified State-wise and district-wise including Andhra Pradesh; and
- (e) whether the Government has assessed the impact and outcomes of this campaign on improvements in women's and children's health indicators and if so, the results of such assessment?

**ANSWER
THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE
(SHRI JAGAT PRAKASH NADDA)**

(a) The "Swasth Nari, Sashakt Parivar Abhiyaan (SNSPA)" campaign was conducted with the aim to strengthen healthcare services for women and children across India, including in the State of Andhra Pradesh, with a focus on improving access, quality care, and awareness through Jan Bhagidaari.

The following activities have been conducted during the campaign:

- 19.7 lakh countrywide dedicated health camps with a footfall of more than 11 crores on all healthcare platforms to provide screenings and specialist and telemedicine services, including counselling activities.
- Provision of medical and health services for women, including check-up for ENT, Eye and Dental check-up.
- Promoting healthy lifestyles such as reducing obesity, local and regional food, distribution of Take Home Ration (THR).
- Focusing on women's health, including screenings for oral, breast and cervical cancer,

anaemia, hypertension, diabetes, tuberculosis and sickle cell diseases.

- Providing maternal and child health services, such as antenatal care (ANC) checkups and immunization and Early Childhood Care and Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF) practices.
- Raising awareness about nutrition, menstrual hygiene, and mental health.
- Active participation of citizens for voluntary blood donation, Nikshay Mitra Volunteer and organ donor registration.
- Distribution of digital cards and special registration including Mother and Child Protection (MCP) Card, Sickle Cell card, Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) enrolment and registration of beneficiary on POSHAN Tracker.

(b) Under NHM, funds are released to States/UTs in Flexible Pool to utilize the same for the campaigns as per their need and priorities.

(c) The State/UT-wise details regarding the number of health camps conducted, including in the State of Andhra Pradesh is placed at Annexure-I as reported by the States and UTs.

(d) The State/UT wise number of beneficiaries screened, including in the State of Andhra Pradesh is placed at Annexure-II as reported by the States and UTs.

(e) The nationwide campaign ran from September 17 to October 2, 2025. As per the report available, key outcomes of the campaign include 62.6 lakh footfalls for antenatal check-ups, 1.17 crore haemoglobin screenings for anaemia in women, 96.5 lakh adolescent girls counselled on menstrual hygiene, 1.16 crore counselled for anaemia, and 1.43 crore children immunized. In addition, over 1 crore women were screened for hypertension, 97.24 lakhs for diabetes, 40.83 lakhs for oral cancer, 37.75 lakhs for breast cancer, and 19.22 lakhs women were screened for cervical cancer.
