AYUSHMAN AROGYA MANDIRs IN ANDHRA PRADESH

2274. DR. C M RAMESH:

Will the **Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is true that the Government has approved 1800 units of Ayushman Arogya Mandirs (Sub-Centres, Health and Wellness Centres) in Andhra Pradesh;
- (b) if so, the details of AAMs approved, district-wise;
- (c) the details of the amount of funds approved, sanctioned, released and spent on the above 1800 units in the said State, especially Anakapalli district;
- (d) the timeframe by which the above AAMs are likely to become operational; and
- (e) whether these AAMs are likely to provide comprehensive primary healthcare services including non-communicable disease screening, teleconsultation, essential drugs & diagnostics and wellness activities through these centres, if so, the details thereof?

(a) to (e): Public Health is a State subject. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare provides technical and financial support to the States/UTs to strengthen the public healthcare services, based on the proposals received in the form of Programme Implementation Plans (PIPs) under National Health Mission (NHM). Government of India provides approval for the proposals in the form of Record of Proceedings (RoPs) as per norms & available resources.

As reported by States/UTs on Ayushman Arogya Mandir (AAM) portal, a total of 1,86,298 AAMs including 11873 AAMs in Andhra Pradesh have been operationalized by strengthening Sub-health Centres (SHCs) and Primary Health Centres (PHCs) in the country, as on 30.06.2026. District-wise number of AAMs operationalized in Andhra Pradesh is enclosed as **Annexure**.

The AAMs incrementally provide 12 package of primary health care services across the country, encompassing Reproductive and child care services, Communicable diseases, Non Communicable diseases (NCD), Palliative Care and elderly Care, Care for common mental disorders, neurological conditions (epilepsy, dementia) and substance use disorders management (tobacco, alcohol, drugs), Oral health, ENT care, and Basic emergency care. To complement the expanded services, the essential list of drugs & diagnostics has been expanded to make 179 drugs & 63 diagnostics at PHC -AAMs and 113 drugs & 14 diagnostics at SHC-AAMs in the country.

Details of State PIP approvals for the state of Andhra Pradesh for AAM under NHM during last three years are as follows:

PM-Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM-ABHIM), launched with an outlay of Rs. 64,180 crore, focuses on developing capacities of health systems and institutions across the country. PM-ABHIM aims to support for infrastructure development for Building less SHC - AAMs, Urban AAMs, Support for Block Public Health Units (BPHUs), Integrated Public Health Laboratories (IPHLs) and Critical Care Blocks (CCB). Under the CSS component of PM ABHIM, administrative approval has been accorded to the state of Andhra Pradesh during scheme period for construction/establishment of 696 Building-less SHC - AAMs and 45 units of Urban AAMs at the total cost of Rs. 471.29 crore.

The Fifteenth Finance Commission (FC-XV) had recommended grants through Local Governments for specific components of the health sectors to the tune of Rs.70,051 crore. As informed by State, administrative approval has been accorded to Andhra Pradesh during the scheme period of FY 2021-22 to FY 2025-26 for construction of 1558 Building-less SHC - AAMs, 100 Building-less PHC- AAMs, 191 Urban PHC - AAMs at the total cost of Rs.1093.25 crore.
