IMPACT OF PM-KISAN SCHEME

2633. SHRI JASWANTSINH SUMANBHAI BHABHOR:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of achievements and success of the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN) scheme in economically empowering the farmers of Dahod Lok Sabha Constituency;
- (b) the total number of farmers who have directly benefited from this visionary scheme in the said region since its inception, year-wise;
- (c) the total amount of funds successfully transferred directly into the bank accounts of farmers through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT), ensuring transparent distribution in the Dahod parliamentary constituency;
- (d) the details of the proactive steps taken and special saturation drives conducted by the Government to ensure 100% registration of eligible tribal and marginal farmers in the Dahod Lok Sabha Constituency; and
- (e) the overall positive socio-economic impact of this continuous financial assistance with regard to agricultural productivity, procurement of agricultural inputs, and the livelihood of the farming community in the region?

ANSWER

- (a) to (e): The PM-KISAN scheme is a central sector scheme launched to supplement the financial needs of farmers with cultivable land-holding. Under the scheme, a financial benefit of ₹ 6,000/- per year is transferred in three equal instalments, into the Aadhaar

seeded bank accounts of farmers through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) mode. Under the PM-KISAN Scheme, Government of India has disbursed over ₹ 4.47 lakh Cr. to the beneficiaries through 23 installments since inception of the Scheme.

As per the impact evaluation study by the Development Monitoring and Evaluation Office (DMEO) of NITI Aayog, the scheme is successfully fulfilling its primary function of providing direct financial assistance to farmers holding agricultural land, thereby enhancing their economic stability and agricultural productivity. The study also shows that over 92 percent of beneficiary farmers utilized the financial assistance for essential agricultural inputs such as seeds, fertilizers, and pesticides, which are particularly important in the face of rising input costs and weather-related uncertainties.

Instalment-wise details of beneficiaries benefitted in Dahod and Mahisagar districts of Gujarat and amount released to them since inception is at Annexure.

In order to ensure that no eligible farmer, including tribal and marginal farmers, is left out, the Government of India undertakes saturation drives in coordination with the States/UTs, including Gujarat. A major nationwide saturation drive was undertaken from 15th November 2023 under the Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra (VBSY), during which, more than 1 Cr. farmers were included under PM-KISAN. Further, under the Government's 100 days initiative in 2024, over 25 lakh eligible farmers were added under the PM-KISAN scheme. A special drive was also conducted in September 2024 to clear the pending self-registration cases, which resulted in the addition of over 30 lakh new farmers. Further, a nationwide saturation drive was undertaken in June, 2026 under PM-KISAN, alongwith the "Khet Bachao Abhiyaan" to expand the coverage of eligible farmers under the scheme, which resulted in the addition of about 17 lakh farmers in the country, including 1 lakh farmers in Gujarat, including Dahod.
