†3182. SHRI RAM SHIROMANI VERMA:

Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS

be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Utraula-Pachperwa-Chandanpur road connecting Shrawasti and Balrampur districts in Uttar Pradesh is in an extremely dilapidated condition, causing severe hardship to local citizens, farmers, traders and commuters traveling towards the Nepal border, if so, the details thereof;**
- (b) whether the Government has taken any action on the continuous demands raised and letters and representations submitted periodically by the local Member of Parliament for the widening and strengthening of the Utraula-Pachperwa-Chandanpur road, during the last seven years;**
- (c) if so, the details of the action taken and the current status thereof and if not, the reasons therefor;**
- (d) whether the Government proposes to accord early sanction and provide the necessary funds for the widening and strengthening of the said road; and**
- (e) if so, the details thereof and the time by which the sanction and necessary funds are likely to be provided?**

ANSWER

(a) to (e) The Government in Ministry of Road Transport & Highways is primarily responsible for development and maintenance of National Highways (NHs). The stretch of Utraula-Pachperwa-Chandanpur is a Major District Road (MDR) under the jurisdiction of State Government of Uttar Pradesh.

The Government keeps on receiving proposals from various State Governments / Union Territories (UTs), including from the State Government of Uttar Pradesh, for declaration / upgradation of State roads including Major District Road (MDR), as NHs. The Government considers declaration of some of the State roads, including MDRs, as NHs from time to time based on the requirement of connectivity and synergy with PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan.
