REPORT

PART – I

NARRATION

The Department of Pharmaceuticals, Ministry of Chemicals & Fertilizers informed that the Indian pharmaceutical industry ranks third globally in terms of volume and eleventh in terms of value. In terms of its size, the Indian Pharmaceutical Industries is currently valued at \$ 50 Billion and is expected to reach \$ 130 billion by 2030. India produces more than 500 APIs and 60,000 generic drugs across 60 therapeutic categories.

I. Setting up of National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA)

2. The New Drug Policy, 1994 envisaged the setting up of **National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA)**. It was set-up in 1997 as an independent body of experts in the Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers, Department of Pharmaceuticals (DoP). NPPA was delegated the powers to implement and enforce the then extant Drugs (Prices Control) Order 1995.

3. NPPA is headed by Chairman in the rank of Additional Secretary to the Government of India. The organization also has a Member Secretary in the rank of Joint Secretary to the Government of India. The other Members of the Authority include the Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI); Adviser (Cost), Office of the Chief Advisor (Cost); and Adviser, Department of Economic Affairs.

The functions of NPPA, *inter-alia*, include:

- a. To implement and enforce the provisions of the DPCO, 1979, 1987, 1995 and 2013 in accordance with powers delegated to it.
- b. To monitor the availability of medicines & medical devices, identify shortages, if any, and to take remedial steps.
- c. To undertake and/or sponsor relevant studies in respect of pricing of drugs/formulations.
- d. To deal with all legal matters arising out of the decisions of the Authority.
- e. To render advice to the Central Government on changes/revisions in pharmaceutical policy.
- f. To render assistance to the Central Government in parliamentary matters relating to pharmaceutical pricing.

4. The Committee desired to know as to why the prices of medicines are so high, and whether the Department is satisfied with the prices of medicines in the market and also whether the prices of medicines should not be brought down. The Department in a written note submitted as follows:

- (a) India is among only 24 countries out of about two hundred countries who are net exporters of formulations and is globally ranked third (Annex 1). This shows that Indian medicine prices are on the average globally among the lowest, since exporters would not be competitive unless prices in India were lower.
- (b) The prices of essential medicines in India are lower in comparison to those in other middle and low income countries, as indicated by the study comparing the prices of top-selling formulations in the said top-selling therapeutic categories and dosage forms with the prices in such other countries. (Annex 2.)
- (c) The rise in prices in essential/scheduled medicines is less than or in line with inflation, as indicated by the analysis of impact of ceiling prices post DPCO, 2013 for top-selling formulations in the top-selling four therapeutic categories that account for 60% value of such medicines in the top-selling four dosage forms that account for 90% value shows that over the 11-year period from March 2014 to March 2025. Similarly, the rise in prices in non-scheduled medicines has been 5.5% per annum, which is broadly in line with inflation over the corresponding period (Annex 3). Thus, prices of medicines on the average have been broadly in line with inflation.
- (d) Estimated annual savings of over ₹24,000 crore have accrued to patients under DPCO, 2013 in respect of essential/scheduled and non-scheduled medicines. (Annex 4).

The above covers both branded and generic formulations.

While the above brings out that medicine price levels in India are among the lowest in the world and considerable reduction in prices and price stability have been achieved under the existing price regulation framework, the framework is revisited from time to time in light of experience and feedback gathered. As a part of this, a Trade Margin Rationalisation (TMR) approach of capping Trade Margin has been implemented as a pilot in respect of 42 high price anti-cancer medicines and during the pandemic, on six COVID related devices. This was done by exercising extraordinary powers available under paragraph 19 of DPCO, 2013, under which such capping can be done only for a limited period. In light of experience of TMR and feedback gathered, the Department of Pharmaceuticals (DoP) and NPPA have undertaken stakeholder consultations regarding incorporation of a suitable enabling provision for applying a TMR approach on DPCO, 2013. The feedback gathered from the consultations is under examination for formulating an appropriate policy view in the matter.

5. During the course of Oral Evidence the Committee requested the representative to tell something about Trade Margin Rationalization (TMR). In reply the representative submitted as follows:

“सर, जो हमारी वर्तमान देश की फार्मा पॉलिसी है, उसमें शेड्यूल्ड ड्रग या एनएलईएम ड्रग की जो लिस्ट है, उस पर सीलिंग प्राइसफिक्सेशन होता है। हमारे पास इसके अलावा

इमरजेन्सी कंडीशन में लिमिटेड टाइम के लिए इमरजेन्सी पावर्स हैं। इसमें ओवरटाइम कुछ-कुछ मामलों में कुछ महंगी कैंसर ड्रग्स, हार्टड्रग्स, कोविड से रिलेटेड कुछ इक्विपमेंट्स वगैरह, हार्ट स्टैंट इन सब चीजों के लिए इसका उपयोग डीपीसीओ के पैरा-9 के तहत किया गया। इन पर प्राइमरी चीज यह की गई कि प्राइसफिक्स नहीं किए गए। इसमें यह कहा गया कि ट्रेड के मार्जिन को फिक्स कर देते हैं, जिससे ट्रेडिंग मार्जिन बहुत ज्यादा न हो। इसमें मोटे तौर पर अलग-अलग चीजों के लिए अलग-अलग ट्रेड मार्जिन्स इंडस्ट्री के करेंट डिस्ट्रीब्यूशन कॉस्ट स्ट्रक्चर को देखते हुए फिक्स किए गए।”

6. The Committee then desired to know as to how the standard of fixations decided:

“सर, इंडस्ट्री को ही देखना पड़ता है। हम यह मानकर चलते हैं कि आज बाजार में अगर डिस्ट्रीब्यूशन मार्जिन यह चल रहा है तो इसका कोई बेस होगा.....हमारा जो करेंट डीपीसीओ है और उसमें जो दाम है, वह हमने डिस्ट्रीब्यूटर लेवल पर फिक्स किए हैं। डिस्ट्रीब्यूटर लेवल पर हमारा जो फिक्सेशन है, उसकी प्राइस को हम फिक्स करते हैं।.....सर, टीएमआर में हमारी सीमा यह है कि टीएमआर जहां हमने लगाया, वहां ठीक-ठीक अनुभव रहा और बचत भी हुई, लेकिन हमारी वर्तमान नीति में जैसा मैंने बताया कि यह केवल हमने इमरजेन्सी और टाइम लिमिटेड यूज के लिए है और आज की तारीख में वर्तमान नीति अलाउ करती है।

इस में हमारे इंडस्ट्री से कुछ कंसल्टेशंस भी हुए कि क्या इसको और व्यापक करना चाहिए। एक सहमति हुई है, लेकिन कुछ बिंदुओं पर लोगों का मतान्तर भी है और डिफरेंटग्रेप्स ऑफ इंडस्ट्री के डिफरेंट ओपिनियंस हैं। हम इस टीएमआर के इश्यू को करेंटली एग्जामिन कर रहे हैं। It has been under active examination of the Department. हम उस पर कुछ व्यू लेकर आगे नीतिगत फैसला लेने की कोशिश करेंगे।”

7. During evidence, when the Committee shared Price List of few renowned pharma companies which exhibited exorbitant and unjustified trade margin often ranging between 500% to 1800% and asked as to why these medicines can not be made available to the citizens at about similar prices as available through the Government initiative like Pradhan Mantri Janaushadi Kendra. The representative of Department of Pharmaceuticals deposed as under:

“Sir, the Jan Aushadhi medicines, as I said, does not go through the normal distribution channel or its costs. The Jan Aushadhi medicine is centrally procured for the whole of the country. So, the scale of economies is very different. Also, there is no market development cost. We also give an incentive and a one-time initial cost to the pharmacies and so on. So those are the things because of which the cost structure becomes different. Till the distributor point, the entire system is run by the PMBI. So, again, it is not like an independent distributor with their cost margins, etc. So it is not directly comparable. That is

the point. So, we cannot pick up a price point from Jan Aushadhi and say the same price point will apply here because it is not an Apple-to-Apple comparison. But, as regards the other point which you are saying, as the CEO, NPPA also said, the viable options seem to be trade margin rationalization. And, we do need to take a policy decision on that. That seems to be the way ahead. The discussions on this originally started not with a drug context. The NITI Aayog floated paper of medical devices. But then, it was felt that maybe it is relevant for this also. A small trial was done for high-value cancer drugs. And, we were also constrained by the fact that the present policy does not permit it. We could only introduce it for emergency use in certain cases for a limited time. But then if you have to make a regular policy, we have done consultations over the last one to two years. And as I said, we are now approaching the stage of concluding the deliberations and the examinations so that we can, lay a specific proposal for the Government's consideration. So, we are approaching that stage now".

8. The representative further apprised the Committee regarding TMR as follows:

"Sir, as I said, TMR is the approach that we are considering and we have done the consultations also. There are one or two outstanding issues on which we are trying to resolve the different points of view, and thereafter we propose to take it for a policy decision."

9. When the Committee pointed out that the issue of TMR is being debated upon from long time and the prices of medicines are sky rocketing and after the multinational pharma companies can be asked to give medicines at the same price which is given under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Aushadhi Yojana. In reply the representative hence submitted as follows:

"Sir, the Jan Aushadhi medicines, as I said, does not go through the normal distribution channel or its costs. The Jan Aushadhi medicine is centrally procured for the whole of the country. So, the scale of economies is very different. Also, there is no market development cost. We also give an incentive and a one-time initial cost to the pharmacies and so on. So those are the things because of which the cost structure becomes different. Till the distributor point, the entire system is run by the PMBI. So, again, it is not like an independent distributor with their cost margins, etc. So it is not directly comparable. That is the point. So, we cannot pick up a price point from Jan Aushadhi and say the same price point will apply here because it is not an Apple-to-Apple comparison. But, as regards the other point which you are saying, as the CEO, NPPA also said, the viable options seem to be trade margin rationalization. And, we do need to take a policy decision on that. That seems to be the way ahead.

10. The Committee enquired, whether the Department has put any mechanism to fix a limit on the benefit accruing to the manufacturer of the medicines. In reply the Department of Pharmaceuticals has stated that the objective of NPPP, 2012 is to put in place a regulatory framework for pricing of drugs with a view to ensure the availability of required medicines – “essential medicines” – at reasonable prices while providing sufficient opportunity for innovation and competition to support the growth of industry, thereby meeting the goals of employment and shared economic well-being for all. The ceiling prices of scheduled medicines and retail prices of new drugs are fixed by NPPA and not by companies. To ensure the availability of essential medicine at reasonable prices, NPPA, fixes the ceiling price of essential medicines, retail price of new drugs defined as per paragraph 2(1)(u) of DPCO, 2013 and monitors the prices of non-scheduled drugs in accordance with provisions of DPCO, 2013. Further, it was the considered decision of the Government to move away from the earlier regime that provided for the control of the profits/benefits accruing to the companies so as to provide sufficient opportunity for innovation and growth in the sector.

11. On being asked whether MRP on PTS of medicine Ciprofloxacin 500 mg and Tinidazole 600 mg is ₹450/- but their MRP is ₹3500/-. The Department in a written reply submitted that NPPA has informed that Ciprofloxacin 500 mg and Tinidazole 600 mg is not a scheduled formulation. As per Pharmarack database, a major database of market prices of medicines in the domestic market, the highest per tablet prices for the said formulation in the month of April 2025 were ₹20.76 for MRP (including taxes) and ₹14.83 for PTS (excluding taxes).

12. When asked whether PTS of Ibuprofen is ₹831/- and its MRP is ₹4560/-. The Department replied as under:

NPPA has fixed ceiling prices of Ibuprofen formulation as below:

All manufacturers are required to sell the formulations (generic or branded) within the notified ceiling prices (plus applicable taxes).

13. When asked that PTS of Labocof is ₹316/- and MRP is ₹2850/- The Department submitted that NPPA has informed that Labocof is not a scheduled formulation. Further, the formulation is not captured in Pharmarack, the principal source database use for monitoring market information in respect of over 14,000 formulations.

14. A detailed price list of medicines of Five (5) common and very popular brands was shared with the representatives of the Department of Pharmaceuticals

(placed at Annexure 5-9) The Price List shows huge profit margins available to retailers as evident from the margin available to them. For eliciting the comments of the Department the price list was also sent as an Annexure to Supplementary List of Points shared with the Department. Wherein the Department was asked why such exorbitantly high trade margins; ranging from over 600% to more than 1100%, are permitted in several commonly prescribed medications used for routine and chronic health conditions. These include widely used anti-allergy drugs and proton pump inhibitors (PPIs), which form part of standard treatment protocols across the country. Some of the specific formulations and their margins are as mentioned in the table below:

The Department in their written reply submitted that presently, prices of drugs are regulated as per the provisions of the Drugs (Prices Control) Order 2013 (DPCO, 2013) based on the National Pharmaceuticals Pricing Policy, 2012, with the objective of ensuring the availability of essential medicines at reasonable prices while providing sufficient opportunity for innovation and competition to support the growth of industry. It follows the principles of essentiality and market-based pricing of formulations only. As per extant provisions of DPCO, 2013, the National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA) under the Department of Pharmaceuticals (DoP) controls prices of medicines by fixing ceiling prices of formulations specified in Schedule-I to DPCO, 2013 which is based on the National List of Essential Medicines (NLEM) and retail prices of new drugs as defined in paragraph 2(u) of DPCO, 2013. Ceiling prices and retail prices are fixed by adding 16% margin to the average of Price to Retailer (PTR) of all brands having market share of equal to or more than 1% appearing in market database. Further, supply chain / marketing channel may vary across different drugs and as per the current policy framework the margin at various levels in the supply chain is not regulated and are part of business practices, and are guided by commercial considerations.

Further, for the non-scheduled formulations, NPPA regulates prices as per the provisions of DPCO, 2013 and manufacturers are not allowed to increase the maximum retail price (MRP) of such formulations by more than 10% of MRP during preceding 12 months, although the average annual price increase by such manufacturers of non-scheduled drugs over the five-year period from April 2020 to March 2025 at 5.6%, which is broadly in line with the Wholesale Price Index (WPI) rise of 5.4% over the same period and is significantly lower than the permissible 10% increase.

In this connection, it is submitted that in a study done through IQVIA, a leading global life sciences consulting firm, Indian prices were compared with those of three other low and middle income countries, viz., Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and Brazil for top-selling dosage forms (tablets, liquids, capsules and injections) of top-selling therapeutic categories (anti-infective, anti-cancer, cardiovascular and hormonal drugs). The study revealed that the prices of both scheduled and non-scheduled formulations in India were comparatively lower. (Annex -10)

Further, access to drugs at affordable prices is being ensured not only through ceiling price fixation of essential medicines and capping price rise of other medicines but also through Jan Aushadhi Kendras that provide quality generic medicines at rates typically 50% to 80% cheaper than branded medicines, cashless provision of medicines under Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana in case of hospitalisation, free provision of essential drugs in public health facilities under Government's Free Drugs Service Initiative, through AMRIT Pharmacy stores, and financial assistance to poor patients under Rashtriya Arogya Nidhi and the Health Minister's Discretionary Grant.

Insofar as the company-specific formulations mentioned in the Point are concerned, it is submitted that assessing the trade margin in respect of a specific formulation requires analysis of various cost components specific to the business operations for

the distribution of that formulation. Under the extant legal dispensation, such cost information is not available to the Department or NPPA. Therefore, inputs in the matter were sought from the Indian Pharmaceutical Alliance (IPA), which is the industry association of major domestic manufacturers.

IPA has informed that supply and distribution of branded generic formulations is done through two types of marketing channels: the “branded generics” channel that typically caters to major demand centres and the “trade generics” channel that typically caters to remote and rural areas that have low-volume sales and account for about 8-9% of the market. The distribution costs for the two channels are structurally different, which translate into high difference in their per unit distribution costs in percentage terms. The following factors are pertinent in this connection:

- (a) Low-volume sales result in apportionment of fixed costs of distribution over a relatively smaller number of formulation units sold, which would translate into trade margins that may be high in percentage terms.
- (b) In the case of formulations sold through the “branded generics” channel, the manufacturer maintains inventory for uninterrupted supply, along with associated significant inventory carrying costs, and also bears the costs of awareness activities related to these products, while the distribution channel only incurs logistics and distribution point costs. In contrast, in the case of formulations sold through the “trade generics” channel, the distribution channel incurs additionally the cost of carrying inventory and awareness.
- (c) Apart from the above additional cost constituents, in the “trade generics” channel, the distribution channel costs are themselves typically higher than the corresponding costs incurred on formulations that are typically marketed through the “branded generics” channel, since the costs of logistics, staffing, expired inventory, cold chain, etc. in the “trade generics” channel are higher as sale volumes are smaller and offtake slower and uncertain and the distribution chain is longer due to this channel being typically adopted for supplies to remote and rural areas. In this connection, it is pertinent that the inventory carrying costs are higher for smaller retailers located away from main towns as they need to carry at least two months of stock to ensure availability, whereas retailers in larger towns who are supplied on daily basis carry only two to three weeks of inventory. Further, the costs of finance for the two sets of retailers may be significantly different as smaller retailers may have smaller balance-sheets and lower credit rating assessment.
- (d) Further, unlike in the case of the “branded generics” channel, where the manufacturer may maintain centralised inventory offering cost advantages accruing from economies of scale, in the case of the “trade generics” channel, there may typically be multiple smaller distributors who would not have the same scale and whose cost of distribution would, therefore, be higher.
- (e) The above cost related factors significantly impact the percentages for trade margin for formulations marketed through the “trade generics” channel in two ways. First, the Price to Stockist (PTS) at which the manufacturer sells becomes lower, reducing the denominator on which the percentage is

calculated and, secondly, the absolute trade margin becomes higher, raising the numerator in the percentage calculation.

Thus, the trade margins for the two channels may differ considerably in percentage terms and may serve to offset higher distribution costs, which enable uninterrupted supply of essential medicines despite inherently high costs and logistical challenges. Notwithstanding the fact that price rise has remained broadly in line with the rise in WPI, that drug prices in India for both scheduled and non-scheduled formulations are among the lowest in the world and that affordable medicines are being made available to the common man through multiple country-wide initiatives as aforesaid, NPPA and DoP are engaged in appropriately addressing emerging issues on an ongoing basis. As part of this, NPPA invoked an exceptional clause under DPCO, 2013 that allows for fixing of ceiling price of drugs in case of extraordinary circumstances in public interest, to cap the trade margin for 42 high-priced anti-cancer medicines as a pilot under a Trade Margin Rationalisation (TMR) approach. Further, in light of experience, DoP and NPPA have undertaken stakeholder consultations regarding incorporation of a suitable enabling provision for TMR in DPCO, 2013, and the feedback gathered from the consultations is under examination for formulating an appropriate policy in the matter.

15. On being asked about mechanism been put in place by the Department to control the MRP of medicines. The Department submitted the measures taken to keep the prices of essential medicines under control are summarised below:

- (a) NPPA fixes the ceiling prices of scheduled medicines, that is, the medicines specified in the said Schedule. The prices fixed by NPPA are applicable to all Manufacturers and marketers selling the specified formulations, whether generic or branded. Manufacturers and marketers of scheduled medicines (branded or generic) are required to sell the same within the ceiling price fixed by the NPPA and applicable GST and annual revision based on WPI. NPPA also refixes the ceiling price after five years. The average price reduction due to refixation of prices under NLEM, 2022 is about 17%, leading to annual savings of approximately ₹3,788 crore to patients.
- (b) NPPA also fixes the retail prices of new drugs as defined in DPCO, 2013 for existing manufacturers of scheduled formulations. Till 13.2.2025, retail price of over 3,100 new drugs under DPCO, 2013 have been fixed.
- (c) For non-scheduled formulations (both branded and generic), manufacturers are required to not increase the maximum retail price by more than 10% per annum.
- (d) In addition, NPPA has fixed the prices of number of drugs, in public interest, as follows:
 - (i) In 2014, NPPA capped the MRP of 106 non-scheduled anti-diabetic and cardiovascular treatment drugs, resulting in estimated annual savings of about ₹350 crore to patients.
 - (ii) Trade margin of non-scheduled formulations of 42 select anti-cancer medicines were capped under a trade margin rationalisation

approach, wherein price of about 500 brands of medicines were reduced by an average of about 50%, resulting into estimated annual saving of about ₹ 984 crore to patients.

- (iii) In February 2017, ceiling prices of coronary stents were fixed, resulting in estimated annual savings of about ₹11,600 crore to patients.
- (iv) In August 2017, ceiling prices of orthopaedic knee implants were fixed, resulting in estimated annual savings of about ₹1,500 crore to patients.
- (v) In June/July 2021, trade margin of oxygen concentrators, pulse oximeter, blood pressure monitoring machine, nebuliser, digital thermometer and glucometer were also capped, resulting in estimated annual savings of about ₹1,000 crore to consumers.

16. When the Committee desired to know regarding scheduled drugs and non-scheduled drugs and how this classification of the drugs will be helpful in providing medicines to the common man at cheaper prices. The Department submitted that as per paragraph 2(1)(zb) of DPCO, 2013, “scheduled formulation” means any formulation, included in the First Schedule whether referred to by generic versions or brand name. MoHFW notifies the National List of Essential Medicines (NLEM) which is a list of medicines that are considered essential for addressing the priority healthcare needs of a population. The NLEM is included in the Schedule-I of DPCO, 2013. NPPA fixes the ceiling prices of these essential medicines specified in Schedule-I of the DPCO, 2013, in accordance with the provisions of the DPCO, 2014 on the basis of market-based data. All manufacturers of scheduled medicines have to sell their products within the ceiling price (plus applicable Goods and Service Tax) fixed by the NPPA. Further, prices fixed by NPPA are applicable to all the manufacturers/marketers selling the said formulation whether generic or branded. NPPA has fixed ceiling prices of 928 formulations under NLEM, 2022 and previous NLEMs.

17. Further, as per paragraph 2(1)(v) of DPCO, 2013, “non-schedule” formulation means a formulation which is not included in Schedule-I. As per the provisions of DPCO, 2013 the manufacturers of non-scheduled formulations are not allowed to increase the maximum retail price of such formulations by more than 10% per annum.

18. During oral evidence the representative further elaborated the issue of scheduled and non-scheduled medicines as under:

“Sir, in the present policy framework, as the Secretary mentioned, so far as the scheduled medicines are concerned, the prices are controlled. The ceiling price is fixed by the NPPA across the industry; so, nobody can sell that medicine more than the ceiling price fixed. They can sell it at a lower price.

What we fix is PTR plus 16 per cent margin is allowed. And over and above that, they can add the local taxes which essentially is a GST and that should be the MRP and nobody can sell it above the price. So far as the non-scheduled medicines are concerned, the companies are free to fix their prices. That is the existing policy framework. Now, the regulation that comes from the NPPA is that once they fix the price at the initial stages, they cannot increase it more than 10 per cent during a 12-month period. That is the control we exercise over them. But as regards the initial fixation, we do not have any regulatory framework for that at the moment. Your point is well taken and it is something of a concern for us also. It is regarding the variation in the prices of the same formulation, same molecules going into but different brands, different companies. There is a huge variation. So one of the things that has been coming up for consideration is that how do we control this. TMR is being looked at as a viable option to control these price variations so that the margin is fixed by the Government. Beyond that, they cannot charge. As I said, there have been discussions on this and there is broad agreement on a major part of the proposal but there are some issues from different industry groups. So those are being debated and maybe soon we will have some kind of a framework for that.”

19. The Committee then desired to know the opinion of the Department to reduce the cost of medicines in view of Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadi Pariyojana scheme and steps can be taken in this regard. In a written reply the Department submitted as follows :

- (a) The Government has launched the Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana scheme with the objective of making quality generic medicines available at affordable prices to all. Under the scheme, dedicated outlets known as Jan Aushadhi Kendras (JAKs) have been opened to provide quality generic medicines at rates that are typically 50% to 80% cheaper than branded medicines. Over 16,000 JAKs have been opened across the country till date. 2,100 types of medicines and 310 surgicals and devices are covered under the product basket of the scheme, covering all major therapeutic groups, such as cardiovascular, anti-cancers, anti-diabetics, anti-infectives, anti-allergic and gastro-intestinal medicines and nutraceuticals. Over the last 10 years, medicines sold through JAKs have resulted in estimated savings of about ₹38,000 crore to citizens in comparison to the maximum retail prices of corresponding leading branded medicines in the market.
- (b) Under Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) of the Department of Health and Family Welfare, health assurance/insurance cover of ₹5 lakh per family per year is provided for secondary or tertiary care hospitalisation, including for medicines. Over 41 crore persons have been issued PMJAY cards.
- (c) Under the Free Drugs Service Initiative of the National Health Mission, essential drugs are provided free of cost in public health facilities.
- (d) Under the Amrit (Affordable Medicines and Reliable Implants for Treatment) initiative of the Department of Health and Family Welfare, affordable

medicines are provided for the treatment of cancer, cardiovascular and other diseases, implants, surgical disposables and other consumables etc., at a significant discount of up to 50% on market rates through AMRIT Pharmacy stores set up in number of hospitals and healthcare institutions.

- (e) Financial assistance is provided to poor patients belonging to families living below the poverty line, who suffer from major life-threatening diseases including cancer, under the umbrella scheme of Rashtriya Arogya Nidhi and the Health Minister's Discretionary Grant.
- (f) NPPA fixes the ceiling prices of scheduled medicines. The prices fixed by NPPA are applicable to all Manufacturers and marketers selling the specified formulations, whether generic or branded. Manufacturers and marketers of scheduled medicines (branded or generic) are required to sell the same within the ceiling price fixed by the NPPA and applicable GST and annual revision based on WPI. It also refixes prices after five years. The average price reduction due to refixation of prices under NLEM, 2022 is about 17%, leading to annual savings of approximately ₹3,788 crore to patients.
- (g) NPPA also fixes the retail prices of new drugs as defined in DPCO, 2013 for existing manufacturers of scheduled formulations. Retail price of over 3,200 new drugs under DPCO, 2013 have been fixed till date.
- (h) In case of non-scheduled formulations (both branded and generic), manufacturers are required to not increase the maximum retail price by more than 10% per annum.
- (i) In addition, NPPA has fixed the prices of number of drugs, in public interest, as follows:
 - (i) In 2014, NPPA capped the MRP of 106 non-scheduled anti-diabetic and cardiovascular treatment drugs, resulting in estimated annual savings of about ₹350 crore to patients.
 - (ii) Trade margin of non-scheduled formulations of 42 select anti-cancer medicines were capped under a trade margin rationalisation approach, wherein price of about 500 brands of medicines were reduced by an average of about 50%, resulting into estimated annual saving of about ₹ 984 crore to patients.
 - (iii) In February 2017, ceiling prices of coronary stents were fixed, resulting in estimated annual savings of about ₹11,600 crore to patients.
 - (iv) In August 2017, ceiling prices of orthopaedic knee implants were fixed, resulting in estimated annual savings of about ₹1,500 crore to patients.
 - (v) In June/July 2021, trade margin of oxygen concentrators, pulse oximeter, blood pressure monitoring machine, nebuliser, digital thermometer and glucometer were also capped, resulting in estimated annual savings of about ₹1,000 crore to consumers.

20. The Committee then desired to know whether the Department has undertaken any study regarding difference in the PTS and MRP printed on the medicines. The Department submitted that no such study has been undertaken by the Department. However, the Indian Pharmaceutical Alliance (IPA), which is the industry association of major domestic manufacturers, has informed that the pharmaceutical industry

operates under various models: patented drugs, branded generics, trade generics and pure generics.

21. Asked about the present status of the pharmaceutical policy stated to be under consideration of the Department and timeline of the policy is likely to be finalized, it was submitted that the Department of Pharmaceuticals has held stakeholder consultations regarding various provisions of DPCO, 2013. Various stakeholder groups and associations were invited to make presentations and submissions and give their recommendations during the course of interactive deliberations. The matter is under examination in the Department, keeping in view the suggestions and recommendations gathered from stakeholders.

22. When asked to state that whether it is a fact that as soon as a drug is put under DPCO, its production is stopped. The Department submitted that NPPA has informed that no such instance has come to its notice.

23. When specifically pointed out that whether Glimepiride with Metformin combination was capped under DPCO but the companies replaced it with Glimepiride plus and Metformin plus Voglibose and then charged higher price and came out of the purview of the DPCO the Department submitted that Ceiling prices are fixed for scheduled formulations. Both Glimepiride with Metformin combination and Glimepiride plus and Metformin plus Voglibose are not scheduled formulations.

24. When asked whether the prices of medicines are controlled at PTS and not on the MRP. The Department stated that Price of a scheduled formulation is controlled by NPPA by fixing its ceiling price. Ceiling price plus applicable local taxes gives the MRP. Thus, for a given level of taxation, MRP of medicines is controlled for scheduled formulations.

25. The Committee desired to know the reasons for the huge difference in the prices of stents available in the market and control of the Department in regard to the rising prices of stents used by heart patients. The Department in their reply stated that The Department of Health and Family Welfare incorporated coronary stents [Bare Metal Stents (BMS) and Drug Eluting Stents (DES)], which include metallic DES and Bioresorbable Vascular Scaffold (BVS) / Biodegradable stents, into NLEM, 2015 on 19.7.2016. Following this, coronary stents were included in Schedule I to DPCO, 2013 on 21.12.2016. NPPA initially fixed and notified ceiling prices for coronary stents on 13.2.2017 at ₹7,260 for BMS and ₹29,600 for DES, including metallic DES and BVS/Biodegradable stents.

On 12.2.2018, NPPA revised the ceiling prices of coronary stents to ₹7,660 for BMS and ₹27,890 for DES, including metallic DES and BVS/Biodegradable stents. Subsequently, the ceiling prices were revised every year based on the annual WPI.

The ceiling prices of coronary stents fixed from time to time over the period from 2017 onwards are as below:

All manufacturers are required to sell coronary stents within the ceiling price (plus applicable Goods and Service Tax) fixed by NPPA.

26. The Committee enquired negotiating the medicines accumulate in the stores at half price in market are being sold in exorbitant prices in the Hospital and steps taken in this regard. The Department in their written reply submitted that NPPA fixes the ceiling prices and retail prices of scheduled formulations and new drugs respectively, in accordance with the provisions of DPCO, 2013. However, manufacturers/marketers are at liberty to sell at a price below the ceiling price too and may do so based on their respective business considerations.

27. On being asked about the Cardiac stents ranging from 30 thousand to two lakh rupees and even more are available in the market and there are no guidelines for the patients to choose which stents to be implanted and it is very difficult for the patient to decide, if any guidelines issued by the Department in public interest for selection of stents. The Department submitted that NPPA fixed and notified ceiling prices for coronary stents. Presently, the ceiling prices for coronary stents are ₹10,509.79 for Bare Metal Stents (BMS) and ₹38,267.18 for Drug Eluting Stents (DES) including metallic DES and Bioresorbable Vascular Scaffold (BVS) / Biodegradable Stents. All manufactures/marketers are required to sell coronary stents within the ceiling price fixed by NPPA.

28. It came to the notice of the Committee that a life saving cancer drug like Peg L-Asparaginase (3750 IU) being listed with an MRP of Rs.38,215.50 and is being sold at Rs.9,200 – a staggering 76% is being offered on OncoHealthMart.com indicating that the actual trade price may be far lower than the MRP, with excessive margins built in for retail markups. When Committee desire to know as to why there is no regulation or margin cap on such high-value, essential medicines under the DPCO framework. The Department in written reply submitted that in respect of the

sale of the specific formulations mentioned in the Point, it is submitted that assessing the trade margin in respect of a specific formulation requires analysis of various cost components specific to the business operations for the distribution of that formulation. Under the extant legal dispensation, such cost information is not available to the Department or NPPA. Therefore, inputs in the matter were sought from the Indian Pharmaceutical Alliance (IPA), which is the industry association of major domestic manufacturers.

IPA has informed as follows:

- (a) There has been a rise in cancer incidence in recent years, prompting hospitals to invest in infrastructure for early diagnosis, treatment monitoring and comprehensive patient care, and keeping this in view, pharmaceutical companies may offer higher trade margins to hospitals and clinics. The overall cost of oncology treatment in hospitals and clinics is often influenced by essential components such as patient support programs, ongoing monitoring by specialists and management of side effects, all of which are vital to ensuring safe and effective care.
- (b) Distributors and online retailers in any product segment at times offer deep discounts as costs incurred for customer acquisition to achieve the scale necessary for business viability and may subsequently raise prices.
- (c) Insofar as the specific formulations mentioned in the Point are concerned, it is informed that most leading companies do not supply their products to OncoHealthMart.com, as it is not one of their authorised stockists, distributors or channel partners. As such, the Association is not in position to comment on the authenticity or quality of products being sold on this platform at deep discounts compared to the printed MRP.

29. The Committee have been informed that an anti-cancer medicine like Brcaone 150 mg (used in breast and ovarian cancer) is listed at an MRP of Rs.45,000 and sold at Rs.8,800/- is being given by OncoHealthMart.com and indicate a manipulative inflation of MRPs to enable retail profiteering. The Committee desire to know what measures has the Department taken to audit and regulate MRPs of non-scheduled anti-cancer drugs, especially when they are being sold at a fraction of their listed price in the open market. The Department in their written reply stated that in respect of the sale of the specific formulations mentioned here in the reply given in the preceding para may be referred to. The Department further submitted that with regard to audit of MRPs of drugs, it is submitted that the extant legal dispensation does not provide for audit of drug costs.

Under DPCO, 2013, manufacturers are not permitted to increase MRP of such formulations by more than 10% of MRP during preceding 12 months.

With regard to regulation of anti-cancer drugs, it is submitted that the following price regulatory actions have been taken:

- (a) NPPA has revised the ceiling prices of 131 anti-cancer scheduled formulations, resulting in reduction of around 21% in the ceiling prices from the ceiling prices fixed under NLEM, 2015 and annual savings of around ₹294.34 crore to patients.

- (b) NPPA has also fixed retail price of 29 non-scheduled anti-cancer formulations as new drugs.
- (c) NPPA has invoked an exceptional clause under DPCO, 2013 that allows for fixing of ceiling price of drugs in case of extraordinary circumstances in public interest, to cap the trade margin for 42 high-priced anti-cancer medicines under a Trade Margin Rationalisation (TMR) approach, reducing MRP of 526 brands of these medicines by an average of about 50% and resulting in annual savings of around ₹984 crore to patients.

Further, DoP and NPPA have undertaken stakeholder consultations regarding incorporation of a suitable enabling provision for TMR in DPCO, 2013, and the feedback gathered from the consultations is under examination for formulating an appropriate policy in the matter.

RECOMMENDATIONS/OBSERVATIONS

NEED FOR REVIEW IN THE PRICE REGULATION FRAMEWORK OF MEDICINES

1. The Committee note that a wide range of frequently prescribed medicines, used for common ailments and chronic conditions are being sold at a high prices with unjustified trade margin. When asked about the huge differential in price to supplier *viz-a-viz* MRPs of the medicines, the Department has cited reasons such as distribution cost, etc which was not found convincing. When asked about the Departments inaction to curb the trade margins to the tune of 600% to 1100% in common medications, the Department's reply appears unsatisfactory as it relied heavily on a general explanation of the Drugs (Prices Control) Order, 2013 (DPCO, 2013). The apparent lack of any control over trade margins, especially in the case of non-scheduled drugs, leaves the door open for widespread profiteering at the cost of patients. The Committee desire that the Department undertake a comprehensive review of the extant price regulation framework to plug the existing loopholes in the pricing mechanism effecting the ordinary citizen.

REGULATORY BLIND SPOTS IN DPCO, 2013: THE URGENT NEED TO EMPOWER NPPA

2. The Committee note that the existing Drugs (Prices Control) Order 2013 (DPCO) is structurally inadequate to curb pricing malpractices in India's pharmaceutical sector. Whereas the DPCO empowers the National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA) to fix ceiling prices for drugs listed under the National List of Essential Medicines (NLEM), but it fails to extend this regulatory authority to the unscheduled drugs. As such the NPPA is not empowered to regulate trade margins for non NLEM drugs in cases where excessive markups are evident on widely used and lifesaving medicines. This regulatory gap allows manufacturers to launch non-scheduled formulations, both branded and generic, at arbitrary points. Although they are technically restricted from increasing the maximum retail price (MRP) by more than 10 percent annually, the absence of initial price fixation renders this control largely meaningless. This loophole requires to be corrected. The Price to Stockist (PTS) data also remains undisclosed to the public, as platforms like Pharma

Sahi Daam and Sugam App shows only MRPs and failed to reveal the true extent of profiteering. Fixed dose combination (FDC) drugs, which account for a substantial share of prescriptions in India, also remain outside the ambit of price regulation despite their widespread use and potential for irrational combinations. The Committee therefore, recommend that the Department should look into the matter and initiate ameliorative steps in this regard. The Committee would like to be apprised by the steps taken by the department.

TRADE MARGIN RATIONALIZATION

3. The Committee note that, a Trade Margin Rationalization (TMR) approach of capping Trade Margin was implemented as a pilot in respect of 42 high price anti-cancer medicines and during the pandemic, on six COVID related devices by exercising extraordinary powers available under paragraph 19 of DPCO, 2013, under which such capping can be done only for a limited period. In the light of experience of TMR and feedback gathered, the Department of Pharmaceuticals (DoP) and NPPA have undertaken stakeholder consultations regarding incorporation of a suitable enabling provision for applying a TMR approach on DPCO, 2013. The feedback gathered from the consultations is under examination for formulating an appropriate policy view in the matter. A perusal of these events reveals that TMR approach was implemented during the pandemic i.e. way back in the year 2019-2020 and a considerable time period of about five years have elapsed and in order to control the prices of medicines in the country the Department and NPPA is trying to incorporate suitable enabling provision for applying a TMR approach on DPCO, 2013 such delays unnecessarily impending on the provision for applying a TMR approach in DPCO, 2013. The Committee therefore, desire that the Department of Pharmaceuticals in consultation with NPPA should come forward for a policy review in the matter at the earliest so that medicines are available to the ordinary citizens at affordable prices.

UNDUE PROFITS/BENEFITS ACCRUING TO DRUGS MANUFACTURING COMPANIES

4. The Committee note that the objective of National Pharmaceutical Pricing Policy (NPPP), 2012 is to put in place a regulatory framework for pricing of drugs with a view to ensure the availability of required medicines at affordable prices while providing sufficient opportunity for innovation and competition to support the growth of industry, thereby meeting the goals of employment and shared economic well-being for all. To ensure the availability of essential medicines at affordable prices, NPPA, fixes the ceiling price of essential medicines and monitors the prices of non-scheduled drugs in accordance with provisions of DPCO, 2013. The Committee note that the PTS of Ciprofloxin 500 mg and Tinidazole 600 mg which came to notice of the Committee, is Rs. 450/- but its MRP is Rs. 3500/- hence a whopping difference of Rs. 3050. Similarly PTS of Ibrufin and Labocof is Rs. 831/- and Rs.316/- but their MRP is Rs.4560/- and Rs.2850/- respectively hence again a big difference of Rs.3729/- and Rs.2534/-. Against this backdrop the Committee desire that the Department should review the matter, so that medicines to the common man should be made available at justifiable rate. The Committee may be apprised of the decision taken in the matter.

FIXATION OF PRICES OF SCHEDULED/NON-SCHEDULED FORMULATIONS BY NPPA

5. The Committee note that National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA) fixes the ceiling prices of scheduled medicines and the prices so fixed by NPPA are applicable to all manufacturer and marketers selling the specified formulation, whether generic or branded. At the initial stage, non-scheduled drugs are not subject to price regulations/fixations. However, as regard non-scheduled formulation (both branded and generic) manufacturer are required not to increase the maximum retail price by more than 10% per annum. However, the Committee fails to understand the distinction made by NPPA regarding scheduled and non-scheduled formulations. It seems evident that NPPA needs to put more control on prices of non-scheduled formulation to obviate scope for abuse by manufacturers and marketers. The Committee therefore, desire that NPPA should consider some appropriate control over prices of non-scheduled formulations which are more in use as has been done in the case of scheduled formulations. Where prices are under check with more effective

control. The Committee would like to be apprised of the steps taken by the Department as well as NPPA in this regard.

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE PRICE TO STOCKIST (PTS) AND MAXIMUM RETAILS PRICE (MRP)

6. The Committee note that as regard undertaking any study regarding difference between the Price to Stockist (PTS) and Maximum Retails Price (MRP) printed on the medicine, the Department has submitted that it has not undertaken any such study. The Committee are of the view that by undertaking such a study the difference between the PTS and MRP would be highlighted and reasons for the difference would also emerge besides other benefits to the end consumer by way of reduction in the prices of medicines. The Committee, therefore, recommend that the Department should initiate a 'study' in this regard at the earliest and they be apprised of the findings of the study.

PHARMACEUTICAL POLICY

7. As regard pharmaceutical policy under consideration of the Department, the Committee has been apprised that it has held stakeholder consultations regarding various provisions of DPCO, 2013. Further, various stakeholder groups and associations were also invited to make presentations and submissions and give their recommendations in the course of interactive deliberations. Presently, the matter was statedly under examination in the Department, where the suggestions and recommendations from stakeholders were being scrutinised. The Committee are of view that immediate steps should be taken to come forth with a pharmaceutical policy where the thrust should be to provide both scheduled as well as non-scheduled formulations to the people at affordable prices.

SUPPLY OF MEDICINES BY MULTINATIONAL PHARMA COMPANIES AT THE SAME PRICE AS GIVEN UNDER PMJAY

8. The Committee note that the issue of Trade Margin Rationalisation (TMR) was under consideration of the Department for a long time with no final decision taken by the Department so far. In the meanwhile, the prices of essential medicines/formulations have been rising and have become out of the reach of the common man. Against this backdrop, the Committee are of the view

that the multinational pharma companies need more control and a mechanism be evolved to provide medicines to the people at the prevailing Price to Stockist (PTS) under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Aushadhi Yojana (PMJAY). The Committee would like to be apprised of the steps taken in this regard.

HIGH PRICES OF BARE METAL STENT AND DRUG ELUTING STENT

9. As regard the prices of stents available in the market, the Committee note that the NPPA initially fixed and notified ceiling prices for coronary stents on 13 February, 2017 at Rs. 7,260/- for Bare Metal Stent (BMS) and Rs.29,600/- for Drug Eluting Stents (DES). Subsequently, the prices of Bare Metal Stents and Drug Eluting Stents were revised from time to time. The ceiling price of Bare Metal Stent as fixed on 1 April, 2024 is Rs. 10,509.79 and the price of Drug Eluting Stent is fixed Rs.39,267.18. It may be seen that the prices of Bare Metal Stent and Drug Eluting Stent has increased by Rs.3,249.79 and Rs.9,667.18 respectively. In addition to this, the patients have to pay the applicable Goods and Service Tax as fixed by NPPA and charges of Hospital etc. The Committee note the increase in the prices of Bare Metal Stent and Drug Eluting Stent which comes to around 44 percent and around 29 percent respectively. The Committee therefore, recommend that the NPPA as well as the Department should look into the matter to bring down the prices of stents in our Country. The Committee also recommend that the NPPA should strictly monitor and ensure that the stents are not made available to the patients over and above the prices fixed by it and cases over charging, if any, may be dealt with strictly. The Committee would like to be apprised of the steps taken in this regard.

TRANSPARENCY AND ACCOUNTABILITY IN ONCOLOGY DRUG PRICING

10. The Committee find gaps in clarity and consistency in so far as pricing mechanism of cancer drugs are concerned. While the Department of Pharmaceuticals and NPPA acknowledges the need for detailed analysis to assess trade margins on specific formulations, they also conceded that such data was not available with the Department or NPPA. The Committee feels that this raises serious questions about how policy oversight is exercised in the absence of critical information. The Committee are of the considered view that the reliance on inputs from the Indian Pharmaceutical Alliance (IPA), an industry body with inherent commercial interests, is bound to affect objectivity.

Admittedly, the IPA justifies higher trade margins for oncology products citing increased hospital infrastructure costs and comprehensive care requirements. The Committee, however, find this explanation lacks quantitative backing and does not directly address concerns of pricing transparency or affordability. Additionally, the Committee find that IPA's claim that most leading companies do not supply to OncoHealthMart.com and therefore cannot comment on the authenticity of products being sold at deep discounts appears to skirt the core issue of regulatory oversight over online drug sales. The Committee note that the Department's response, appears to dilute accountability in so far as a concrete mechanism for ensuring pricing fairness or product authenticity in the market is still lacking in the present system. The Committee therefore recommend that the Department take immediate and concrete steps to put in a robust mechanism to ensure full transparency in trade margins and pricing of cancer drugs. To this extent, the Committee desire that the Department and NPPA to come up with a robust mechanism to collect real time data on pricing information directly from manufacturers, hospitals, and distributors and establish a regulatory framework for online drug sales, including strict monitoring of platforms like OncoHealthMart.com, to ensure that only authentic and approved products are sold in the market. The Committee are of the considered opinion that without these steps, patient safety and affordability remain at serious risk, and regulatory oversight will remain weak and ineffective. The Committee therefore recommend that requisite action plan with strict timelines be put in place at the earliest. The Committee may be apprised of the action taken of the matter.

STRENGTHENING OF PRICE REGULATION OF ANTI-CANCER DRUGS

11. The Committee observe that the absence of a legal provision to audit drug costs under the existing law limits the ability to check whether MRPs of cancer medicines are truly justified. The Committee find that although NPPA is endowed with exceptional powers to cap prices and margins, the lack of a permanent, legal mechanism for trade margin control remains to weaken long-term price regulation and transparency and needs to be addressed with top priority and urgency. The Committee therefore, strongly recommend that the Department urgently introduce a clear legal provision in the Drug Price Control Orders (DPCO), 2013, by way of appropriate amendments for effective

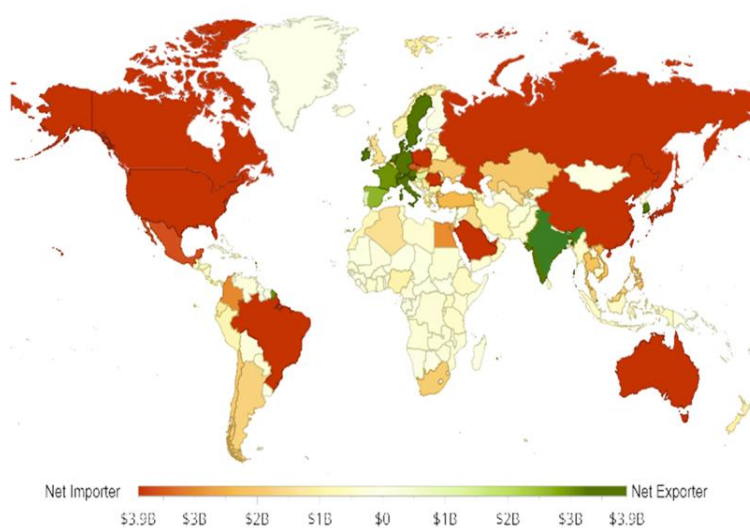
implementation of Trade Margin Rationalisation (TMR). The Committee feel that relying only on exceptional power clauses may not be sufficient to protect public interest in the long term and a permanent, transparent system must be put in place at the earliest to regularly monitor MRPs and trade margins for life-saving drugs like anti-cancer medicines. The Committee therefore desire that in order to ensure fair pricing, prevent unjustified markups, and make essential treatments more affordable for patients, the policy formulation process must be expedited to be followed by earnest implementation process. The Committee may be apprised of the action taken in the matter.

Availability & supply resilience: Trade balance in formulations



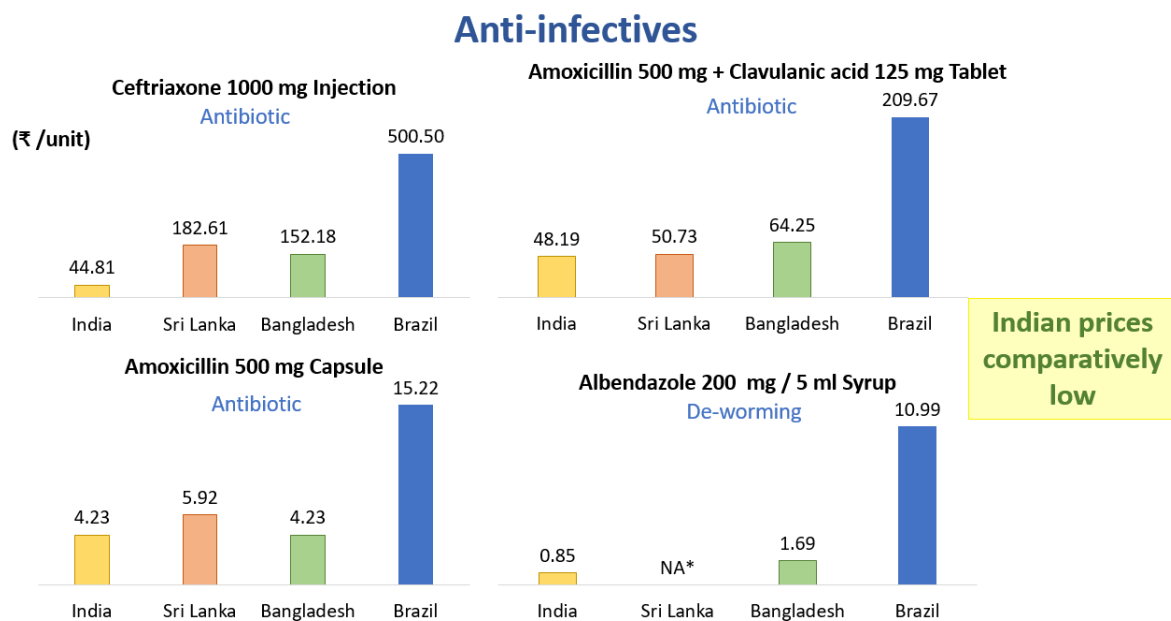

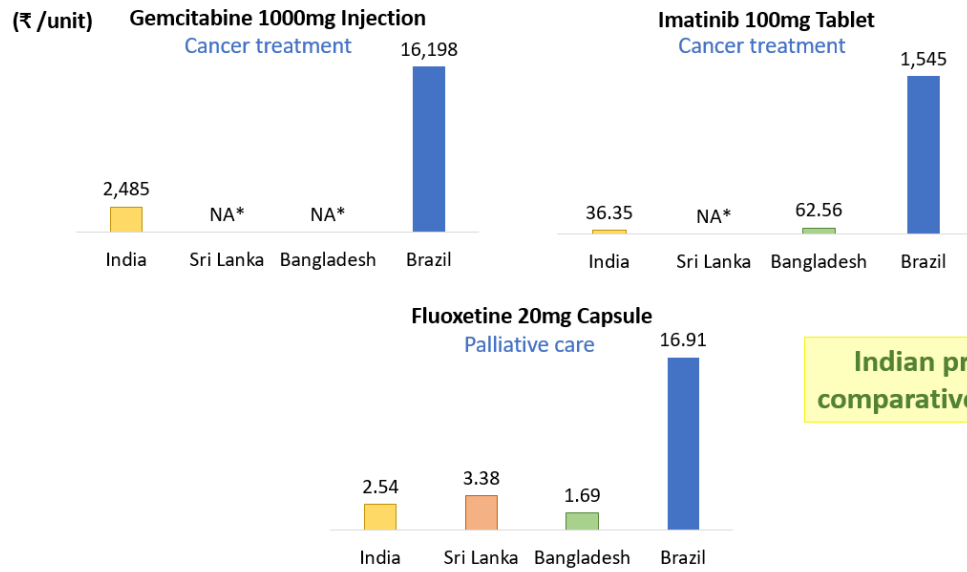

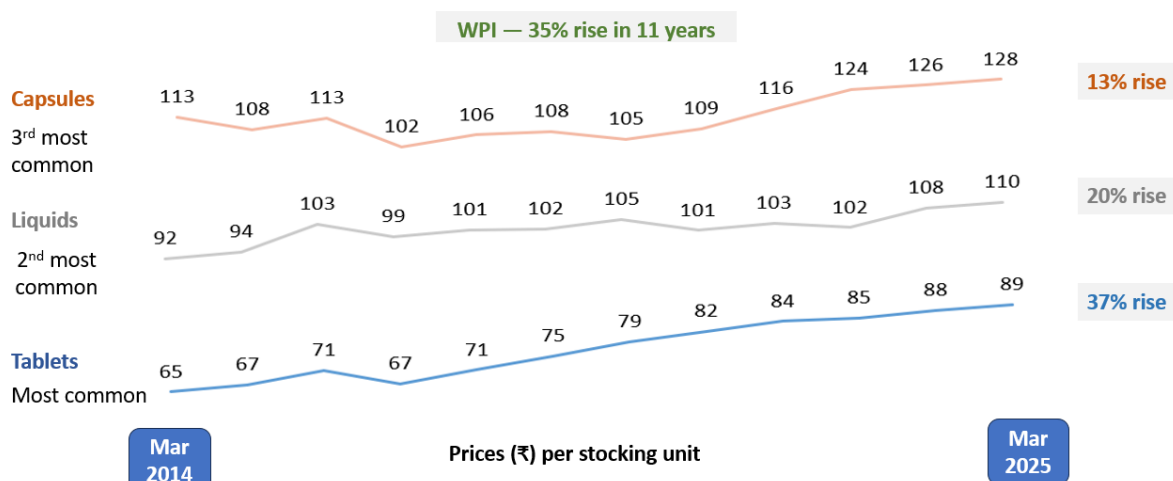

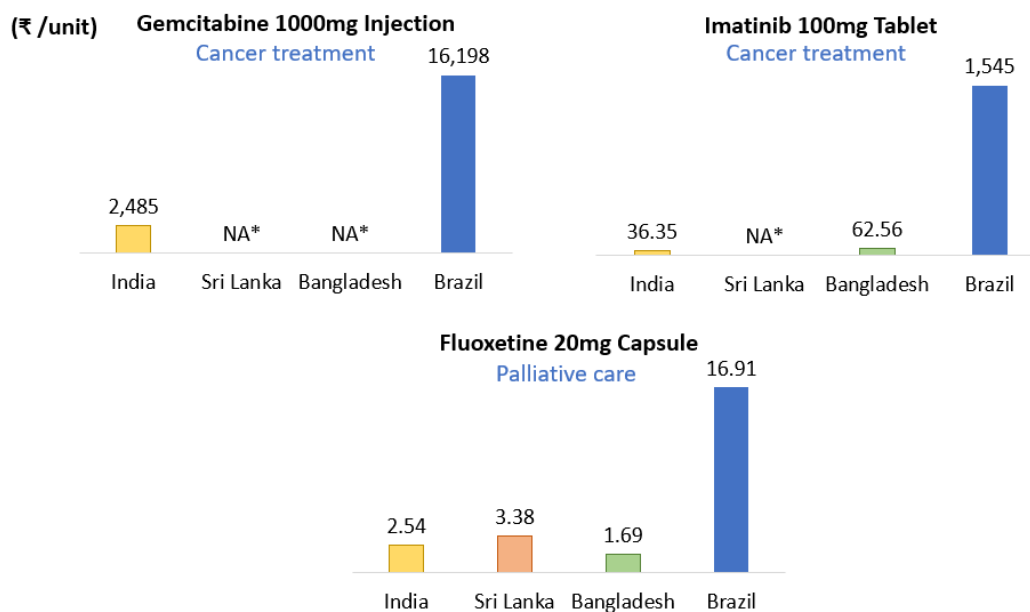

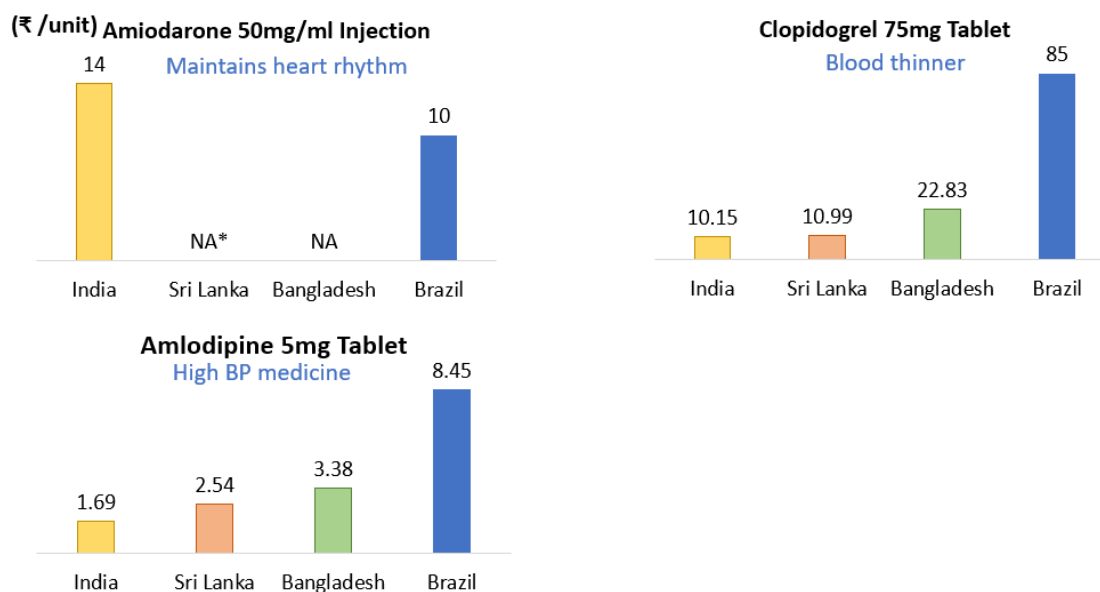

At the outset, the Chairperson welcomed the Members of the Committee and the representatives of the Department of Pharmaceuticals (DoP) to the Sitting of the Committee convened to have a briefing on 'Price Rise of medicines in the Pharmaceutical Sector Impacting the lives of ordinary citizens adversely – A Review.' Drawing the attention of the representatives to Direction 58 of the 'Directions by the Speaker' regarding confidentiality of the proceedings of the Committee, the Chairperson asked them to apprise the Committee about the subject particularly regarding the safeguards put in place to check the rise in the price of medicines in the Pharmaceutical Sector impacting the lives of ordinary citizens and about the functions and mandate of the National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority and how the Department is ensuring availability of medicines at affordable prices through various Drug Price Control Order formulated from time to time.

3. The Secretary, DoP accordingly, briefed the Committee through a Power Point Presentation on various aspects highlighting the Indian Pharmaceutical Industry viz., Provisioning of drugs for public healthcare; Pricing policy and regulatory framework; Price regulation measures; and Upward revision of Ceiling Prices of Drugs etc.

4. The Members then, posed several queries on the subject which are summarized as under:- (i) Whether 5-10 big pharmaceutical companies are controlling the price of drugs in the country? (ii) Whether it is a fact that until the profit margins are controlled, it would be difficult to control the prices of life saving medicines such as in the case of stents. (iii) Whether life saving drugs have become out of reach of poor people due to the high cost of these medicines; (iv) Whether Pharma Companies such as Sun Pharma, Arvindo, Dr. Reddy's and Cipla are making huge profits by selling medicines at high prices? (v) Whether medicines and drugs produced

by these companies are beyond the reach of the Common people; (vi) Whether these Companies have with their own marketing and distribution system have managed to control the prices of medicines; (vii) How many medicines of such big companies are included in the National List of Essential Medicines. (viii) Whether any Regulatory Authority looks after the Corporate and the functioning of such big Pharmaceutical Companies; (ix) Whether any steps have been taken to make available medical devices to the deaf and dumb children at nominal prices or free of cost to the economically weaker section of the society particularly in rural and remote areas of the Country; (x) Whether the Department maintains the data of lives saved by the implantation of cardiac stents; (xi) Whether in reply to a Question asked in Delhi Legislative Assembly, it was replied that in the past two years around 100 patients who got heart stent implants done in Delhi Government-Rajiv Gandhi Super Speciality Hospital died at the facility post surgery and in reply the Government stated that in the last two years, 218 patients have succumbed in the Cardiology Department of which 101 were those patients who had undergone stent implantation and angiography procedure; (xii) Whether Cardiac stents ranging from Thirty Thousand to two lakh rupees and even more are available in the market and there are no guidelines for the patients to exercise an informed choice of the stents to be implanted.

5. The Members also shared their experience on the issues pertaining to the subject as follows:-

A. One medicine is being manufactured by two or three branded Companies with differential prices. For instance Zyloric tablet costs Rs.2.21 but it is being sold in the market at Rs. 50; Generic medicines are not available in the most chemist shops due to low percentage of commission while chemists sell branded medicines of big companies due to higher commissions; The nexus exist between big pharma companies and corporate hospital; Big pharma companies sell their branded medicines to corporate hospitals at cheap rates and doctors in these hospitals prescribe medicines of big companies which the patients are forced to purchase at higher prices. Both corporate hospitals and big pharma companies therefore make huge profits.

B. It is fact that cardiac stents are being implanted in the patients without the consent of the patient as well as the family members of the patients; a news item was published in Gujarat newspapers that two patients from Kadi died after Dr. Khyati Hospital in Ahmedabad allegedly conducted an angioplasty on them to benefit from a

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B. It is fact that cardiac stents are being implanted in the patients without the consent of the patient as well as the family members of the patients; a news item was published in Gujarat newspapers that two patients from Kadi died after Dr. Khyati Hospital in Ahmedabad allegedly conducted an angioplasty on them to benefit from a

Government scheme. The Families allege that the doctors admitted the patient without following due procedure and conducted the medical procedure to benefit from Mukhyamantri Amrutam Card. The patients were given stents without consulting their families which led to the death of the patients. Thereafter investigation was ordered and while the investigation was under progress cardiac stents were implanted on some of the patients in the same manner.

6. While the representatives made an attempt to respond to the some of the queries of the Chairperson and Members of the Committee, most of the queries remain unanswered. On the points requiring detailed information which was not readily available, the Chairperson asked the Secretary, DoP to furnish written replies and also replies to all the queries raised by the Members which remained unanswered during the Sitting of the Committee within 15 days.

At the outset, the Chairperson welcomed the Members of the Committee and the representatives of the Department of Pharmaceuticals to the Sitting of the Committee convened to have an oral evidence on the subject 'Price Rise of medicines in the Pharmaceutical impacting the lives of ordinary citizens adversely- A Review'. Drawing the attention of the representatives to Direction 55(1) of the 'Directions by the Speaker' regarding confidentiality of the proceedings of the Committee, the Chairperson asked them to apprise the Committee

3. The Secretary DoP accordingly, briefed the Committee through a Power Point Presentation on various aspects highlighting issues like ensuring affordability and accessibility of drugs to citizens, price regulation frame work, free medicines under the Health Ministry initiatives, Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana, an analysis of impact of price regulation on commonly used dosage forms from March, 2014 to March, 2025, prices per unit of anti-infective drugs, cancer treatment drugs, cardiovascular drugs and hormonal drugs from March, 2014 to March, 2025, Comparison of drug prices with 3rd world countries, comparative study of drug prices vis-à-vis third world countries, comparison of prices of anti-infective drugs, cancer treatment drugs and cardiovascular drugs in India with prices prevailing in Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and Brazil.

4. The Members then posed several queries pertaining to the subject "Price Rise of medicines in the Pharmaceutical impacting the lives of ordinary citizens adversely" specially related to high profit margins charged by some companies where the Maximum Retail Price (MRP) of the medicines becomes 10-20 times of the Price to Stockist (PTS); such margins can not be allowed in a health care system which is based on public welfare and not on profiteering. The representatives stated that to

control the huge margins at retail level the Pharma Companies have held discussion with the Department of Pharmaceuticals and M/o Health and Family Welfare through the process of trade margin rationalization.

5. The representatives made an attempt to respond to the some of the queries of the Chairperson and Members of the Committee. However, most of the queries remain unanswered. On the points requiring detailed information which was not readily available, the Chairperson asked the Secretary, DoP to furnish written replies and also replies to all the queries raised by the Members which remained unanswered during the Sitting of the Committee within 15 days.

6. The Chairperson observed that many questions unanswered or not satisfactory at all. When is the policy coming and since when the all working on it. Uncontrolled MRP these questions are incorporated in List of Points also.
