- (a) & (b) Yes. World Health Organization declared pandemic of Influenza A H1N1 on 11th June 2009.
- (c) The details of quantity and cost of drugs, vaccines and test kits procured during the current financial year and their source are at Annexure-I
- (d) 22 international Airports had facilities for screening incoming passengers in the pre immigration area. Seven of them namely Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai, Hyderabad, Bangalore and Goa have thermal scanners to detect fever cases.
- (e) The number of cases reported month wise and state wise for the current year is at Annexure-II
- (f) A total of 1337 deaths were reported due to Pandemic influenza A H1N1 (as on 24.02.2010)
