Parliament Library is one of the finest and richest repositories in the country. The Library was established in the year 1921 in the then Central Legislative Assembly to assist the Members of Indian Legislature. It was shifted to Samvidhan Sadan (Old PH) in the Central Hall in 1927. The 'Princess Chamber' in the same building was converted into Members Reading Hall in 1958. The Parliament Library Building 'Sansadiya Gyanpeeth' was inaugurated by the then President of India, Shri K. R. Narayanan, on 7 May 2002. It spreads over four floors with covered area of 60,460 square meters. It is a modular and centrally air conditioned building with provision for all the facilities of a modern library. It provides Audio Facilities for Visually Impaired persons.
